The Vishwavidyalaya has 11 teaching departments, namely, Anthropology & Tribal Studies, Forestry & Wildlife, Rural Technology, Biotechnology, Social Work, Political Science, English, Business Administration, Computer Application, Journalism & Mass communication which are running post graduate programmes and School of Studies in Education has a Undergraduate program named as B.Ed.. The Anthropology & Tribal Studies and Forestry & Wildlife has their Ph.D. programme besides its Postgraduate programme. At present University does not have any multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary programme due to non implementation of NEP 2020 in Chhattisgarh.

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is the integral part of National Education Policy, 2020 but at the movement it is not implemented in the University since the Higher Education Department, Directorate of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Govt. of Chhattisgarh, Raipur has yet to issue instructions necessary for implementation of NEP 2020.

In addition to it, the programmes also aim to develop human values, environmental issues, ethical, constitutional and scientific temper among the students.

3.1.1 - The institution Research facilities are frequently updated and there is well defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website and implemented

The University is one of the premiers of higher education and learning in Bastar region of Chhattisgarh. It has research cell that look after the research activities of departmental research and research projects funded by the external agencies in the University. It also assists in the formulation of research projects guidance and has a stated code of ethics to check mal-practices and plagiarism in research. University is using the URKUND software as a Plagiarism Checker Software for Ph.D. scholars provided by UGC. Six faculty are approved Research Guides in two School of Studies at the University since July 2017. 01 Ph.D. has been awarded in the year 2022 and presently 13 research scholars are enrolled in Forestry and Anthropology. The University has adopted the new Ph.D. ordinance (Ordinance 45) as per the revised UGC guidelines. These guidelines permit only those candidates who are enrolled in research work who possess potential and right aptitude for research and have successfully completed the Pre-Ph.D. course work and has provisions for improvement in the quality of research at the doctoral level. The University has established research laboratory and other research facilities in SoS in Forestry & Wildlife and SoS in Anthropology & Tribal Studies.

University is 15 acres as main campus in Dharampura and 25 acres as sub campus in Kalipur has B.Ed., MBA and MCA Building all the 10 departments are equipped with Classrooms, seminar halls, laboratories and computer lab with internet connectivity with computers, printers, scanners, smart board, LCD Projectors and photocopiers, 1 Conference Room is in Administrative Building. The University has one transit hostel one boy's and one girl's hostel. One boys hostel and guest house which is under construction.

Equipments in the SOS are seed germinator, bacteriological incubator, horizontal laminar flow cabinet, oven universal, Soxhlet extraction, pH meter digital, autoclave, hot plate rectangular, compound microscope, conductivity meter type 304 (systronics), digital pH meter systronics, spectrophotometer double beam UV-VIS, Spreading Caliper, Sliding Caliper, Goniometer, Anthropometric rod, Rodcampus, stethoscope, Sphygmomanometer etc.

University Library has a huge collection of Library Resources, Reading Hall and Computer Centre. The library has total collection of 20217 books (Text & Reference Books), 138 Journals and back Volumes. Quality research Vishwavidyalaya using DrillBit software for checking plagiarism. The Building Committee takes decision for expansion/construction based on the availability of land, funds and budget.
