About the Institution:

Mahishadal Girls' College is the first established women's' college in Purba Medinipur district. The college was established on 1st August 1969 with the aim of spreading the light of higher education among the girls in the surrounding rural and remote areas. The college is currently affiliated to Vidyasagar University. In the year 2019, the college was re-accredited at **B** level by NAAC Peer Team. At present, students from different districts of the state are getting higher education from this college. The college has taken the initiative to start various departments including some professional courses which have helped in attracting students from different parts of the states. At present, it is one of the leading women's colleges in West Bengal.

About our department:

Mahishadal Girls' College has introduced a Post Graduate course, Master of Social Work (regular full-time programme) affiliated to Vidyasagar University since the academic session 2015-2016. It is a coed course of 4 semesters in 2 years duration. Apart from classroom teaching, the course also includes extensive internships, field visits, dissertations and orientation visits to various NGOs. In addition, programmes like class seminars, quiz competitions, departmental visits, workshops, publication of wall magazines, awareness programmes and cultural programmes are organised from time to time to motivate the students and enhance their leadership qualities. In any case, the department has a very close and intimate relationship with the neighbouring communities.

Theme of the seminar:

Social development generally refers to the overall transformation of individuals and society so that everyone can achieve moral, social, physical and material well-being. Egalitarian development is a desirable goal, but remains only an ideal. Despite all development efforts, the differences in the various dimensions of development between societies, regions and groups are becoming ever greater. The differences become clear when anybody compare different regions or countries with each other. Development takes place in different areas such as economy, health, education, infrastructure, technology, etc. Maintaining daily livelihoods and other basic needs is a major challenge for the majority of people in our society.

There is ample evidence that many regions, communities and population groups are being marginalised and even excluded from the benefits of economic growth. They are increasingly vulnerable to: i) poverty, ii) social injustice, iii) human rights violations and gender bias, iv) violence and human trafficking, v) poor health conditions, vi) low levels of education, vii) poor infrastructure, viii) dependence on rudimentary technology and many other issues that often outstrip the measures to address them.

To alleviate this situation, various governments have taken a number of initiatives since independence. Various non-governmental and voluntary organisations have also played an important role in this regard. More recently (in April 2014), the Indian government has made Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) mandatory by amending the Companies Act, 2013 (under Section 135 of the Act). Accordingly, companies have to spend at least 2 per cent of their net profits in the preceding three years on CSR, especially in the areas of education, hunger and poverty alleviation, gender equality and many others. CSR is essentially divided into four categories: Environmental Responsibility, Ethical or Human Rights Responsibility, Philanthropic Responsibility and Economic Responsibility.

Corporate Social Responsibility plays a crucial role in addressing various current social development issues. By utilising their CSR funds, companies participate directly or indirectly in the development of the community. They do this by engaging in community development projects, supporting infrastructure development and working with local organisations to meet specific needs. These include poverty alleviation, building schools, healthcare facilities or access to clean water, providing renewable energy sources, promoting recycling and investing in environment friendly technologies, creating jobs and much more.

In this one-day International Seminar, the above scenarios will be discussed with due vigour by the speakers and presenters based on their observations and experiences.

The author must adhere to APA-6 style for referencing.

N.B. Selected papers will be published by an international/national publisher in a book volume with ISBN after undergoing double blind review and plagiarism report. If required, a minimum publication fee will be charged and communicated to the authors prior to publication.
