

ORDINANCE No. 45

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY

(As approved by the Co-ordination Committee at its meeting)

Dt. 12-8-93 w.e.f. 01-09-93)

I. A candidate for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy must, at the time of application, hold Master's degree with atleast 55% marks (50 % marks for SC/ST HANDICAPPED CANDIDATE) or an equivalent grade of M. Phil. degree of the University, a deemed University or any other University incorporates by any law for the time being inforce and recognised by the University.

I. Provided that a candidate who has atleast 7 years experience of research/teaching with atleast 5 Papers published in standard research journal, may be permitted to get registered for Ph.D. degree, even if he/she does not possess 55% marks at masters degree.

II. Provided further that in the examinations under the faculty of Ayurveda & Medical where no divisions are awarded to the successful examinees the minimum requirement or obtaining 55% or marks shall not apply.

2. A candidate must apply for registration for Ph. D. degree of his subject on the prescribed form obtainable on payment of prescribed fee, stating,

- (i) his qualification and experience ;
- (ii) subject in which he proposes to work ;
- (iii) the field or topic of Research work ;
- (iv) name of the supervisor (alongwith the name of Co-supervisors, if any) under whom he wishes to work and the place/places at which he/she wishes to carry on investigations together with the consent of the supervisor and Co-supervisors, if any.

The application must also be accompanied with :

- (a) Registration fee of Rs.1000.00

(b) A certificate from the Head of the University Teaching Department/School of Studies or the Principal of the College affiliated to the University or Head of a Research Institute recognised for the purpose by the University testifying that adequate facilities exist and stating that the Head of the University Teaching Department/School of Studies or the Principal or the Head of the Research Institute will, in case the candidate is permitted, allow the candidate to work in his department or college or institute under the supervision of the person/s mentioned in the application.

(c) Attested copies of the mark sheet/grade sheet of Master's degree examination and M.Phil degree examination, eligibility and migration certificates wherever necessary should be enclosed to the application. Application for registration may be submitted any time during the academic year.

(d) A certificate from the Head of the Institution where he/she wishes to prosecute his/her research work, that he/she has paid the following first installment fees, be enclosed :

- (i) Tuition fee (Rs. 300.00 for Six month)
- (ii) Library fee (Rs. 120/- for Six month)
- (iii) Library caution money as per provisions of the institution.
- (iv) Identity card Rs. 10.00 once only
- (v) Laboratory Rs. 240/- for six month (for research scholars where laboratory work is involved).
- (vi) Laboratory caution money Rs. 100.00 once only and refundable.

(e) A certificate from the University Library that he has paid the library fee along with caution money as follows be also enclosed :

- (i) Library fee (Rs. 120.00 for Six months)
- (ii) Library caution money Rs. 250.00 once only and refundable.

Provided that the teachers of the University and teachers under the U.G.C. & scheme of teacher fellowship will not be required to pay the fees as in para 2-d.

- (iii) University library fee once only and refundable. 250.00
- (iv) Six monthly progress report Fee at the time of submission. 125.00
- (v) Six monthly progress Report Let Fee. 25.00

(If report not submitted on time)

- (f) After payment of fees along with the form of application the candidate will be provisionally admitted.

Provided that the application is found in order on being scrutinized by a Dean of faculty appointed by the Kulpati.

3. At the time of his/her submission of application, the candidate shall be eligible to submit synopsis (as per Appendix-1) of his proposed research work along with the title of thesis (in seven copies) duly forwarded by the supervisor and Head of the Institution where the candidate is working. He shall be required to make an oral presentation of the proposed work before the Research Degree committee consisting of the following members:

- (i) Kulpati or his nominee.
- (ii) Dean of the Faculty.
- (iii) Head of the University Teaching Department/School of Studies in the subject.
- (iv) Chairman, Board of Studies in the Subject.
- (v) One external subject expert of the rank of University Professor to be appointed by the Kulpati, ordinarily out of a panel of 5 experts given by the Chairman of the Board of Studies concerned. The team of panel shall be conterminus with the chairman Board of studies.

External expert and two other members shall form the quorum.

Note-1. On the request of the supervisor Kulpati may permit him to be present as an observer during the oral presentation of his candidate.

2. No. TA and D.A. shall be payable to the candidate and the supervisor for attending the Research Degree Committee meeting.

4. The meeting of the Research Degree Committee shall be held in the University Office twice a year preferably in February and October. The committee shall recommend the eligibility of the person for the appointment as Supervisor/Co-supervisor, The

committee shall also prepare a list of approved Supervisor/Co-Supervisor along with their specializations as per provisions of the Ordinance. This list shall be available with the Registrar.

The committee shall recommend suitability of the topic of research and the registration of the candidate for the Ph. D. degree.

On approval by the RDC the candidate shall be registered and enrolled as a student from the date the Head of the Department/School of Studies/College/Institution forwarded the application or the date on which the candidate deposits the registration fee, whichever is later. He will also be required to pay regular tuition, library and laboratory fees (six monthly) during research tenure.

Provided that if the RDC does not recommend a candidate for registration to Ph.D. degree, the caution money deposited by the candidate shall be refunded.

5. A candidate shall ordinarily be permitted to work for Ph.D degree in the subject in which he/she has obtained his master's degree.

Provided that research work leading to Ph.D degree may be allowed in allied subjects of interdisciplinary nature of the same faculty or of allied faculties. In such cases the candidate may also be permitted to work under one or two co-supervisors, alongwith the supervisor.

6. A candidate shall pursue his research at the institution from where his/her application form has been forwarded under section 2 (b) of the Ordinance.

Provided that a candidate permitted to work in a research establishment recognised by the University shall be required to take atleast one co-supervisor alongwith the supervisor; one of them should be the teacher of the University and the other a Teacher/Scientist/Scholar/Director of the Institution where the candidate is actually/working.

Provided also a candidate may be permitted to carry out his/her practical work in a Research Institution/Research Lab. /Laboratory of a University recognized by the University for the purpose under the supervision of a Scientist/Director/Teacher of the Institution who may or may not be the co-supervisor of the candidate.

7. The person recommended as Supervisor/Co-supervisor to guide the Research Scholar must be:

(i) A Professor/Reader in a University Teaching Department/School of Studies or a college affiliated to the University possessing either Doctorate degree or has published five research papers in standard Research Journals.

(ii) A teacher of a University Teaching Department/School of Studies /Colleges affiliated to the University who has obtained a Doctorate degree in the subject and has published atleast five Research papers in standard Research Journals has atleast five years P.G. or 10 years U.G. Teaching experience

OR

(iii) (a) A Scientist, Scholar/Director working in a research institute/organization/establishment/Laboratory, recognised by the University as a research centre, who has obtained a doctorate degree and published 5 research papers on concerned subject in standard research journals and has 5 years post-doctoral research experience.

(b) The person recommended as co-supervisor to guide Research Scholar together with Supervisor must be : A Teacher/Scientist/Director of any University/Research Establishment who has obtained a Doctorate degree, and has published atleast five research papers in standard Research journals with 5 year post-doctoral research experience.

(c) A recognised supervisor who fails to publish any research paper over a duration of five years shall not be eligible to enroll any new candidate under his supervision. Provided that the persons who have been recognised as supervisors/Co-supervisors shall be eligible to supervise even after their superannuation.

Provided also that the teacher who has been recognised as Supervisor/Co-supervisor under the repealed ordinance shall continue to be recognised as Supervisor/Co-supervisor provided further that a person who is himself registered for Ph. D. degree of any University shall not be eligible to act as Supervisor/Co-supervisor or member of any committee mentioned in this Ordinance.

8. (a) The candidate shall pursue his research at the approved place of research under the Supervisor/Co-supervisor on the approved subject. The candidate shall be permitted to submit his/her thesis not earlier than 24 months and not later than four calendar years from the date of registration. In case a candidate does not submit his/her thesis within four calendar years, from the date of registration and does not apply for extension in time his/her registration shall stand automatically cancelled. Provided that the period for submission of thesis can be extended by one year by the Kulpati, if he/she applies for extension atleast one month before the expiry of registration period together with a fee of Rs. 500.00. In case the candidate does not submit his/her thesis within the extended period, his/her registration shall stand automatically cancelled.

Provided also that Kulpati may permit a candidate to get re-registered on the same topic on payment of a re-registration fee of Rs. 1000.00. The minimum period of 24 months and attendance shall not apply to such reregistered candidate.

- (b) The candidate possessing M.Phil degree or a teacher with 5 years teaching experience at the time of registration can submit his/her thesis after 18 months instead of 24 months as provided in section 8 (a) of the Ordinance.

- (c) The candidate shall put in atleast 200 days attendance in the institution concerned or with the supervisor.

9. The candidate may be allowed to change the Supervisor by the Kulapti, on the recommendation of the committee constituted by the Kulpati for this purpose under

special circumstances. No major change in the topic of research will be permitted due to change in supervisor.

10. The University shall obtain every six months a record of attendance, receipt of fees paid and a progress report of the work of the Research Scholar from his/her supervisor as per Appendix-2. If the progress of work is not found satisfactory in two successive reports or no reports are received for a period of one year and the candidate fails to deposit fees, the Kulpati may order the removal of the name of the scholar from the list of those registered for the Ph.D. degree.

11. (a) The candidate shall submit six copies of the summary of the thesis together with a list of research papers published, communicated for publication, if any through, his Supervisor to the Registrar about three months prior to the anticipated date of submission of thesis.

(b) The supervisor shall submit a panel of at least six names of examiners actively engaged in the concerned area of research not below the rank of Reader or College Professor in a sealed cover to the Registrar. Provided that the panel of examiners shall be obtained from the Head University Teaching Department/School of Studies/Chairman, board of Studies of the Subject concerned, in case the candidate is related to the supervisor.

(c) On the receipt of the panel of examiners from the supervisor and summary from the candidate, the Registrar shall call a meeting of Examination Committee of the subject constituted U/S 44 of the Adhiniyam. The Committee considering the panel submitted by the Supervisor/Head, University Teaching Department/School of studies/Chairman, Board of studies, will prepare a panel of six names to act as examiners.

THE TERM RELATIONS SHALL INCLUDE: - Father, Mother, Wife, Husband, Daughter, Son, Grand Son, Grand Daughter, Brother, Sister, Nephew, Niece, Grand Nephew/Niece, Uncle, Aunt, Son-in-law, Sister-in-law, Father-in-law, First cousin-in-law etc.

12. The candidate shall supply three types written/photocopies hard bound of his thesis alongwith the following:

(a) The candidate shall try as far as possible to publish communicate paper (s) for publication in standard Research Journals and published/communicated paper (s) be appended.

(b) The thesis must be accompanied by a declaration from the candidate that the thesis embodies his own work and he/she has worked under the Supervisor at the approved place of work for the required period as per provisions of para 8 of Ordinance. (Appendix-8)

(c) The certificate from the Supervisor together with Co-supervisor, if any, that the thesis fulfills the requirements of the Ordinance relating to the Ph.D. degree of the University. (Appendix-4)

(d) The candidate shall also remit with the thesis Rs. 1,500.00 (Rupees One Thousand five hundred) as the examination fee.

13. On receipt of the thesis alongwith the certificates and fee it shall be sent to the examiners already consented as per para 11 (C) of the Ordinance.

14. The thesis to be accepted for the award of the Ph.D. degree must comply with the following conditions:

(a) It must be a piece of research work characterised either by the discovery of the facts or by a fresh approach towards the interpretation of facts. In either case it should evince the candidate's capacity for critical examination and sound judgement.

(b) It must be satisfactory in point of language and presentation of the subject matter.

15. The examiners shall categorically recommend in the prescribed proforma (Appendix-5) acceptance, revision or rejection of the thesis together with detailed comments on

the points spelled out in clause 4 of the Ordinance. The examiner must also give a list of the questions he wishes to be asked at the viva-voce examination.

16. (a) The examiners may seek clarification of the subject matter of the thesis from the Supervisor. The provision will be incorporated in the letter to be sent to the examiners while sending the thesis.

(b) The Kulpati can recall the thesis from an examiner who fails to send the report within three months of the date of despatch of the thesis and appoint another examiner.

17. (a) In case both the examiners reject the thesis or one of them rejects the thesis and the other recommends a revision the thesis shall be rejected.

(b) If both the examiners recommend for the revision of the thesis the candidate shall be called upon to revise the thesis in the light of the observations of examiners.

(c) One examiner approves the thesis and the other rejects it or recommends for revision drawn from the panel of examiners by the Kulpati with both the reports of earlier examiners. The names of earlier two examiners shall not be disclosed to the third examiner. The third examiner shall be asked to give his/he opinion on the points, raised the earlier examiners while rejecting or recommending revision of the thesis opinion shall be final.

(d) In case both the original examiners accept the thesis for the award of the Ph.D. Degree or in the event of it being referred to the third examiner, the third examiner accepts the thesis for the award of the Ph.D. Degree, the candidate shall be called upon to appear at the viva-voce examination before a board of examiners comprising of the Supervisor, Co-Supervisor (if any) and one of the two examiners (selected) by the Kulpati who have accepted the thesis for the award of the Ph.D. Degree. Provided that the Kulpati shall appoint head, Department/School of Studies or Chairman, Board of Studies of the subject

concerned to act as viva-voce examiner, in place of the Supervisor in case the candidate is related to the Supervisor.

- (e) The Supervisor/Head, University Teaching Department/School of Studies, Chairman, Board of Studies of the concerned, as the case may be, shall be communicated the name of the external examiner appointed by the Kulpati to conduct the viva-voce examination. The date fixed for the viva-voce be informed to the candidate and the Registrar.

Provided that (looking to the) in special circumstances Kulpati may appoint alternate viva-voce examiners if both the examiners are not in a position to conduct the viva-voce examination.

- (f) The viva-voce examination shall be conducted at the University Teaching Department/School of Studies in the subject or at any place fixed by the University for the purpose. The date, time and place of viva-voce examination shall be notified by the Registrar on the University Notice Board atleast a week in advance. At the time of viva-voce examination the board of examiners shall be provided the reports of the examiners which shall be returned alongwith the report of viva-voce examination to the Registrar.

- (g) The candidate shall present the work embodied in the thesis before the board of examiners, members of faculty, research scholars and other interested persons. After the presentation of the research work the Board shall ask question together with those questions which have been given alongwith examiners reports. Others in the audience can also ask questions and the candidate shall reply only those questions which are permitted by the external examiner.

- (h) In case the recommendation of the viva-voce examiners differ from that of the thesis examiner or there is difference of opinion between the viva-voce examiners the candidate shall re-appear at a second viva-voce examination within six months. If the candidate fails to satisfy the viva-voce examiners a second time, his/her thesis shall be finally rejected. Such candidates would be

required to pay an additional fee of Rs. - 200.00 for second viva-voce. The external examiner for second viva-voce shall be appointed by the Kulpati.

18. If the examiners recommend that the candidate be asked to revise/improve his thesis, the Kulpati shall permit the candidate to resubmit his thesis not earlier than six months and not later than eighteen months, the period being counted from the date of the issue of order to the candidate. The candidate shall be provided examiner (s) reports without disclosing the names of the examiners to enable him/her to improve the thesis, All the copies of the thesis shall also be returned to the candidate.

In case the candidate is allowed to resubmit the thesis he/she will have to pay a fee of Rs.- 500.00 afresh at the time of resubmission, but it shall not be necessary for him to reproduce any certificate of further attendance at the Institution at which he/she carried out the work.

The resubmitted three copies of the thesis must mark clear mention that it is a revised version.

The thesis shall be got examined as far as possible by the examiners who finally recommended for the revision.

In case both the examiners of revised thesis accept the thesis for the award then the candidate shall be awarded the Ph.D. Degree on successful viva-voce examination as per provisions of clause 17 of the Ordinance.

In case a candidate is asked to revise the thesis under clause 17 (b) and one of the examiners recommends again for revision and the other accepts the thesis for award then the thesis shall be sent to the third examiner. If the third examiner rejects or recommends for revision the thesis shall stand rejected. If, he accepts for the award then the candidate shall be awarded the ph. D. Degree on successful viva-voce examination as per provision of clause 17 of the Ordinance.

In case a candidate who has been asked to revise to thesis under clause 17 (c) and one of the examiners recommends again for revision and the other accepts the thesis for award then the candidate shall be awarded the Ph. D. Degree on successful viva-voce examination as per provision of clause 17 of the Ordinance.

If the revised thesis is required to be revised a second time it shall automatically stand rejected.

19. Maximum number of research candidates that can be registered and allowed to pursue research work under a supervisor at any particular time shall be six only.

Provided that the candidates registered with the Co-supervisor shall not be counted for the number of candidates under a Supervisor.


20. No research scholar shall join any other course, study or appear at any other examination conducted by any University leading to a degree (except Certificate/Diploma course of Languages, Research Methodology, Statistics, Computer courses).

21. The thesis shall be published only with the permission of the university and such publication shall state on the title page itself that this was a thesis approved for the award of the Ph.D. Degree of the University.

22. After the viva-voce, the recommendation of the examiners shall be reported to the Executive Council for the award of Ph.D. Degree to the candidate. One copy of the thesis will be kept in the University Library and another copy will be kept in the Departmental Library of the Institution where the research work was carried out; the third will be returned to the Supervisor.

23. After the declaration of the result the successful candidates may be provided the copies of reports of examiners who recommended for the award of the degree on payment of fee of Rs.-100/- The reports will not be disclose the identity of the examiners.

24. The candidates who have been already registered for Ph.D. Degree under the repealed Ordinance will continue to be governed by the Provisions of this or repealed Ordinance.



The candidates who have applied for registration but have not been registered till this Ordinance comes into force shall be governed by the provisions of this Ordinance.

25. On detection of any irregularity, the University shall take suitable steps to withdraw the degree as per provisions of section 6 (12) of the Adhinyam.
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ORDINANCE No. 45
DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY

(As approved by the Co-ordination Committee at its meeting dated 29-04-2010)
(As per letter no. 2815/337/2010, Dated : 08-06-2010)

Preamble

1. The degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) may be granted in any discipline, belonging to any faculty of the Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University (hereafter: University), in which post-graduate studies and/or research is available at the University or at its affiliated Colleges that are recognized as research centers by the University.
2. All academic matters related to Ph.D. degree shall be processed by a Departmental Research Committee (hereafter: DRC) consisting of the following:
 - i. Head of the School/ Department (Chair), for UTD or Principal (Chair), for affiliated colleges of the University
 - ii. All teachers of the School/ Department/ Department of affiliated colleges of the University who are recognized by the University as Ph.D. supervisors
 - iii. There should be at least three members, including the chairman of the DRC.
 - iv. The Kulapati shall nominate members from other/related departments in case the number of recognized Ph.D. guides is less than two in any School/ Department/ approved research centers of the affiliated colleges of the University.
3. Eligibility for Registration for the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy
 - A. A candidate for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy must, at the time of application, holds Master's Degree with at least 55% marks (50 % marks for SC/ ST/DIFFERENTLY ABLED CANDIDATE)/ B. in the seven point scale/ an equivalent grade point average of a University, a deemed University or any other University incorporated by any law for the time being in force and recognized by the University

OR

 Holds M.Phil. degree of a University, a deemed University or any other University incorporated by any law for the time being in force and recognized by the University

OR

 A candidate who has at least 7 years experience of research/ teaching with at least 5 papers published in standard research journal, even if he/she does not possess 55% marks at Master's degree.
 - B. Provided that the candidate will be admitted to the Ph.D. program through an entrance test to be conducted once in a year, preferably in October by the University. The modalities of the test shall be decided by the University.

Candidates provisionally admitted to the program through an entrance test will be awarded with the University Fellowships depending upon their availability.
 - C. Following candidates shall be exempted from appearing at the entrance test:
 - i. Candidates, who qualify UGC-CSIR (JRF) examination, including NET lecturer ship/ SLET/ GATE/ or any other JRF examination conducted by national agencies, such as JCMR, ICSSR etc.
 - ii. Candidates possessing M.Phil. degree from a recognized University.
 - iii. Teacher Fellowship holder and University/ College teachers holding a regular position (regular appointment) and having completed two years of service as teacher in a department or affiliated colleges of the University.
 - iv. Scientists of any recognized national (for example, DST-, CSIR-funded etc.) and international institutions (for example, WHO-funded etc.) having acquired two years experience.

4. Procedure for Admission/Registration

An eligible candidate (refer Clause 3) must apply for registration for Ph.D. degree of his/her subject on the prescribed form obtainable on payment of prescribed fee. The application shall be considered by the DRC of the concerned Schools/ Departments/ Affiliated Colleges.

The DRC will allocate the supervisor, with the mutual consent of the candidate and the guide, for an eligible candidate depending on the number of student per faculty member, the available specialization among the faculty supervisors and the research interest of the student as indicated during interview by the student.

All eligible candidates except in 3 C ii shall be required to undertake course work for a minimum period of one semester. The course work must include research methodology which may consist of quantitative methods and computer applications. The course content shall be designed by the Board of Studies (BoS) of the concerned subject. The course work may also involve reviewing of published research in the relevant field.

On the recommendation of the Supervisor, the course work may be carried out by the candidates in sister schools/ departments/ institutes either within or outside the University.

The candidate shall be evaluated at the end of the semester. If the candidate is not able to pass the course with 50% marks, the candidate shall be allowed to reappear at the examinations within the next 12 months. The respective DRC will conduct the evaluation at the institutional/ departmental level.

While granting provisional admission to candidates to Ph.D. program the DRC will pay due attention to the National/ State reservation policy.

The candidates shall have to pay fees as decided by the university from time to time.

Provided that the teachers of the University and Teachers under the U.G.C. teacher fellowship scheme or any other scheme will not be required to pay the fees, except the registration fee and six-monthly progress report fee. The teachers of the other Universities shall be required to pay the Library and/or Laboratory Caution money.

5. Research Degree Committee (RDC):

The candidate shall be eligible to submit synopsis (as per Appendix-1) of his/her proposed research work, after successfully completing the course work, along with the title of the thesis (in six copies) duly forwarded by the chairman of the relevant DRC. He shall be required to make an oral presentation of the proposed work before the Research Degree Committee consisting of the following members:

- i. Kulapati or his/her nominee
- ii. Dean of the Faculty
- iii. Head of the University Teaching Department/ School of Studies in the subject
- iv. Chairman, Board of Studies in the Subject
- v. One external subject expert of the rank of a University Professor/ Director of recognized Institutes to be appointed by the Kulapati, out of a panel of 3 experts given by the Chairman of the Board of Studies concerned. The term of the subject expert shall be coterminous with the tenure of the Board of Studies.

External expert and two other members shall form the quorum.

- Note:
1. The Supervisor/ Co-supervisor are entitled to be present during the oral presentation of his/her candidate.
 2. No. TA and D.A. shall be payable to the candidate and the Supervisor/Co-supervisor for attending the Research Degree Committee meeting.

6. The meeting of the Research Degree Committee shall be held in the University Office twice a year preferably in July and January. The committee shall confirm a list of approved Supervisor/Co-Supervisor along with their specializations, prepared by the DRC. This list shall be available with the Registrar/ Academic section of the University.

The committee shall formally recommend the registration of the candidate for the Ph. D. degree.

On approval by the RDC the candidate shall be registered and enrolled as a student from the date of his/her application. He/She will also be required to pay regular tuition, library and laboratory fees (six-monthly) during his/her research tenure. The RDC has the right to suggest revision/alterations (if required) in the synopsis forwarded by the DRC.

Provided that if the RDC does not recommend a candidate for registration to Ph.D. degree, the caution money deposited by the candidate shall be refunded.

7. A candidate shall ordinarily be permitted to work for Ph.D. degree in the subject in which he/she has obtained his/her post-graduate degree.

Provided that research work leading to Ph.D. degree may be encouraged in allied subjects of interdisciplinary nature of the same faculty or of allied faculties. In such cases the candidate may also be permitted to work under one or two co-supervisors, along with the supervisor of the University.

8. A candidate shall pursue his/her research at the institution from where his/her application form has been forwarded under Clause 3 (b) of the Ordinance.

Provided that a candidate permitted to work in a research establishment recognized by the University shall be required to take at least one co-supervisor along with the supervisor; one of them should be the teacher of the University and the other a Teacher/ Scientist/ Research Officer/ Director of the Institution where the candidate is actually working.

Includes Institutions and Laboratories run and sponsored by the Union /State Governments or its agencies; and Foreign University/Institution of repute.

Provided also a candidate may be permitted to carry out his/her research/ practical work in a Research Institution/ Research Laboratory/ Laboratory of a University recognized by the University for the purpose under the supervision of a Scientist/ Director/ Teacher of the Institution who may or may not be the co-supervisor of the candidate.

9. Supervisors/ Co-supervisors
The person recommended as Supervisor/Co-supervisor to guide the Research Scholar must be:

i. A Professor in a University Teaching Department/ School of Studies

OR

ii. A Reader/ Associate Professor of the University/ a Professor in a College affiliated to the University possessing a Doctorate Degree and has published five research papers in standard Research Journals

OR

iii. A Lecturer/ Assistant Professor of the University Teaching Department/ School of Studies/ Colleges affiliated to the University who has obtained a Doctorate Degree in the subject and has published at least five Research papers in standard Research Journals (with ISSN) and has at least five years P.G. or 10 years U.G. teaching experience.

However, in order to encourage research interest among teachers of this category, exemption from five years P.G. teaching or 10 years U.G. teaching shall be granted to those who have been awarded with research projects from the State (for example CCOST/ National (for example DST, CSIR, UGC etc.)/ International (for example WHO, Ford Foundation etc.) Sponsoring Agencies or those who have already published at least five papers in SCI/ SSCI/ A&F-CI journals (as listed and revised by Thomson Reuters from time to time).

OR

- iv. A Scientist/ Director/ Scholar, not below the rank of a University lecturer/ Assistant Professor, working in a research Institute/ Organization/ Establishment/ Laboratory/ Library & Physical Education Professionals working in Library/ Physical Education Department, recognized by the University as a research centre, who has obtained a Doctorate Degree in the subject and published 5 research papers on concerned subject in Standard Journals and has five years of experience in the respective field.

Provided that a recognized supervisor who fails to publish any research paper/ publication over duration of five years shall not be eligible to enroll any new candidate under his/her supervision.

Provided that the persons who have been recognized as Supervisors/Co-supervisors shall be eligible to supervise even after their superannuation. However, in this case the superannuated faculty, with the permission of the Chairmen, RDC, shall have to co-opt an additional Co-supervisor, who is in service, from the relevant research center approved by the University.

Provided also a recognized Supervisor/Co-supervisor under the repealed ordinance shall continue to be recognized as Supervisor/Co-supervisor.

Provided further that a person who is himself registered for Ph. D. degree of the University in the subject shall not be eligible to act as Supervisor/ Co-supervisor in the concerned subject or member of the RDC related to the concerned subject mentioned in this Ordinance.

10. Tenure of Ph.D. Work

- (a) The candidate shall pursue his/her research at the approved place of research under the Supervisor/Co-supervisors on the approved subject. The candidate shall be permitted to submit his/her thesis not earlier than 24 months and not later than four calendar years from the date of registration. In case a candidate does not submit his/her thesis within four calendar years, from the date of registration and does not apply for extension on time, his/her registration shall stand automatically cancelled. Provided that the period for submission of thesis can be extended by one year by the Kulapati, if he/she applies for extension within one month after the expiry of registration period together with the prescribed fee. In case the candidate does not submit his/her thesis within the extended period, his/her registration shall stand automatically cancelled.

Provided also that Kulapati may permit a candidate to get re-registered on the same topic on payment of the prescribed re-registration fee. The minimum period of 24 months and attendance shall not apply to such re-registered candidate.

- (b) The candidate possessing M.Phil. degree or a teacher with 2 years teaching experience at the time of registration can submit his/her thesis after 18 months instead of 24 months as provided in Clause 10 (a) of the Ordinance.
- (c) The candidate shall put in at least 200 days attendance, including actual attendance he/she will earn during the course work, in the Institution concerned or with the Supervisor.

11. Change of Supervisor

The candidate may be allowed to change the Supervisor by the Kulapati, on the recommendation of the committee constituted by the Kulapati for this purpose under special circumstances. No major change in the topic of research will be permitted due to change in supervisor.

12. Six-monthly Progress Report

The candidate shall submit every six months a record of attendance, receipt of fees paid and progress report of the work through his/her supervisor as per Appendix-2. If the progress of work is not found satisfactory in two successive reports or no reports are received for a period of one year and the candidate fails to deposit the prescribed fees, the Kulapati may order the removal of the name of the scholar from the list of those registered for the Ph.D. degree.

13. Submission of Summary of Thesis

(a) Prior to submission of the thesis, the candidate shall make a pre-Ph.D. presentation before the DRC that may be open to all faculty members and research students, for getting feedback and comments, which may be suitably incorporated into the draft thesis under the advice of the supervisor.

(b) The candidate shall submit six copies of the summary of the thesis together with a list of at least one research paper published or accepted for publication in a standard journal through his/her Supervisor to the Registrar about two months prior to the anticipated date of submission of thesis.

(c) The supervisor shall submit a panel of at least six names of examiners actively engaged in the concerned area of research not below the rank of Reader or College Professor in a sealed cover to the Registrar. Provided that the panel of examiners shall be obtained from the Chairman, Board of Studies of the Subject concerned, in case the candidate is related to the supervisor.

(d) On the receipt of the panel of examiners from the supervisor and summary from the candidate, the Registrar shall call a meeting of Examination Committee of the subject constituted U/S 44 of the Adhinyam. The Committee considering the panel submitted by the Supervisor/ Chairman, Board of Studies, will prepare a panel of six names to act as examiners.

(e) THE TERM RELATIONS SHALL INCLUDE: Father, Mother, Wife, Husband, Daughter, Son, Grand Son, Grand Daughter, Brother, Sister, Nephew, Niece, Grand Nephew/Niece, Uncle, Aunt, Son-in-law, Sister-in-law, Father-in-law, First cousin-in-law etc.

14.

The candidate shall submit three hard bound copies of his/her thesis along with the following:

(a) The candidate shall have to produce evidence of publication of one research paper (or evidence of acceptance for publication) based on his/her thesis work in standard journal. Such evidence (reprints of publications or acceptance letter for publication) has to be appended at the end of the thesis.

(b) The thesis must be accompanied by a declaration from the candidate that the thesis embodies his/her own work and he/she has worked under the Supervisor at the approved place of work for the required period as per provisions of Clause 10 of Ordinance (Appendix-3).

(c) The certificate from the Supervisor together with Co-supervisors, if any, that the thesis fulfills the requirements of the Ordinance relating to the Ph.D. degree of the University (Appendix-4).

(d) The candidate shall also remit with the thesis the prescribed examination fee.

(e) Submission of Electronic copy of the Thesis/ Dissertation (ETD) is mandatory at the time of submission of the Ph.D. thesis (Appendix-5). The University shall submit a soft copy to the UGC within a period of 30 days after the award of the degree, for hosting the same in INFLIBNET, accessible to all Institutions/Universities.

15. Evaluation Procedures following Submission of the Thesis

On receipt of the thesis along with the certificates and fee it shall be sent to the examiners already consented as per Clause 13 (d) of the Ordinance.

16. The thesis to be accepted for the award of the Ph.D. degree must comply with the following conditions:

- (a) It must be a piece of research work characterized either by the discovery of the facts or by a fresh approach towards the interpretation of facts. In either case it should evince the candidate's capacity for critical examination and sound judgment.
- (b) It must be satisfactory in point of language and presentation of the subject matter.

17. The examiners shall categorically recommend in the prescribed proforma (Appendix-6) acceptance, revision or rejection of the thesis together with detailed comments on the points spelled out in clause 16 of the Ordinance. The examiner must also give a list of the questions he/she wishes to be asked at the viva-voce examination.

18. (a) The examiners may seek clarification of the subject matter of the thesis from the Supervisor. The provision will be incorporated in the letter to be sent to the examiners while sending the thesis.

- (b) The Kulapati can recall the thesis from an examiner who fails to send the report within three months of the date of dispatch of the thesis and appoint another examiner.

19. (a) In case both the examiners reject the thesis or one of them rejects the thesis and the other recommends a revision the thesis shall be rejected.

- (b) If both the examiners recommend for the revision of the thesis the candidate shall be called upon to revise the thesis in the light of the observations of the examiners.
- (c) If one examiner approves the thesis and the other rejects it or recommends for revision the thesis shall be sent to the third examiner drawn from the panel of the examiners by the Kulapati with both the reports of earlier examiners. The names of earlier two examiners shall not be disclosed to the third examiner. The third examiner shall be asked to give his/her opinion on the points, raised by the earlier examiners while rejecting or recommending revision of the thesis. The opinion of the third examiner shall be final.

- (d) In case both the original examiners accept the thesis for the award of the Ph.D. Degree or in the event of it being referred to the third examiner, the third examiner accepts the thesis for the award of the Ph.D. Degree, the candidate shall be called upon to appear at the viva-voce examination before a board of examiners comprising of the Supervisor, Co-Supervisor (if any) and one of the two examiners selected by the Kulapati who have accepted the thesis for the award of the Ph.D. Degree. Provided that the Kulapati shall appoint the Chairman, DRC or Chairman, Board of Studies of the subject concerned to act as viva-voce examiner, in place of the Supervisor in case the candidate is related (Clause 13e) to the Supervisor.

- (e) The Supervisor/ Chairman, DRC, Chairman, Board of Studies of the subject concerned, as the case may be, shall be communicated the name of the external examiner appointed by the Kulapati to conduct the viva-voce examination. The date fixed for the viva-voce be informed to the candidate and the Registrar. Provided that in special circumstances Kulapati may appoint alternate viva-voce examiners if both the examiners are not in a position to conduct the viva-voce examination.

- (f) The viva-voce examination shall be conducted at the University Teaching Department/School of Studies in the subject or at any place fixed by the University for the purpose. The date, time and place of viva-voce examination shall be notified by the Registrar on the University Notice Board about a week in advance. At the time of viva-voce examination the board of examiners shall be provided with the reports of the examiners which shall be returned along with the report of viva-voce examination to the Registrar.

(g) The candidate shall present the work embodied in the thesis before the board of examiners, members of faculty, research scholars and other interested persons. After the presentation of the research work the Board shall ask question together with those questions which have been given along with examiners reports. Others in the audience can also ask questions and the candidate shall reply only those questions which are permitted by the external examiner.

(h) In case the recommendation of the viva-voce examiner differs from that of the thesis examiner or there is difference of opinion between the viva-voce examiners, the candidate shall re-appear at a second viva-voce examination within six months. If the candidate fails to satisfy the viva-voce examiners a second time, his/her thesis shall be finally rejected. Such candidates would be required to pay the prescribed additional fee for the second viva-voce. The external examiner for second viva-voce shall be appointed by the Kulapati.

20. If the examiners recommend that the candidate be asked to revise/improve his/her thesis, the Kulapati shall permit the candidate to resubmit his/her thesis not earlier than six months and not later than eighteen months, the period being counted from the date of the issue of order to the candidate. The candidate shall be provided examiner (s) reports without disclosing the names of the examiners to enable him/her to improve the thesis. All the copies of the thesis shall also be returned to the candidate.

In case the candidate is allowed to resubmit the thesis he/she will have to pay the prescribed fee afresh at the time of resubmission, but it shall not be necessary for him to reproduce any certificate of further attendance at the Institution at which he/she carried out the work.

The resubmitted three copies of the thesis must mark clear mention that it is a revised version.

The thesis shall be got examined as far as possible by the examiners who finally recommended for the revision.

In case both the examiners of revised thesis accept the thesis for the award then the candidate shall be awarded with the Ph.D. Degree on successful viva-voce examination as per provisions of clause 19 of the Ordinance.

In case a candidate is asked to revise the thesis under clause 19 (b) and one of the examiners recommends again for revision and the other accepts the thesis for award then the thesis shall be sent to the third examiner. If the third examiner rejects or recommends for revision the thesis shall stand rejected. If, he accepts for the award then the candidate shall be awarded with the Ph.D. Degree on successful viva-voce examination as per provision of clause 19 of the Ordinance.

In case a candidate who has been asked to revise to thesis under clause 19 (c) and one of the examiners recommends again for revision and the other accepts the thesis for award then the candidate shall be awarded with the Ph.D. Degree on successful viva-voce examination as per provision of clause 19 of the Ordinance.

If the revised thesis is required to be revised a second time it shall automatically stand rejected.

21. Maximum number of research candidates that can be registered and allowed to pursue research work under a supervisor at any particular time shall be SIX only. The submission of a thesis shall create a vacancy for the admission of a new candidate for Ph.D. degree under the concerned supervisor.

Provided that the candidates registered with the Co-supervisor shall not be counted for the number of candidates under a Supervisor.

22. No research scholar shall join any other course, study or appear at any other examination conducted by any University leading to a degree (except Certificate/Diploma course of Languages, Research Methodology, Statistics, Computer courses).
23. The candidate, if so desires, is allowed to publish his/her thesis. However, such publication shall state on the title page itself that this was a thesis approved for the award of the Ph.D. Degree of the University.
24. The University agrees that a Ph.D. student is the owner of the copyright in his/her thesis.
25. After the viva-voce, the recommendation of the examiners shall be reported to the Executive Council for the award of Ph.D. Degree to the candidate. One copy of the thesis will be kept in the University Library and another copy will be kept in the Departmental Library of the Institution where the research work was carried out; the third will be returned to the Supervisor.
26. After the declaration of the result the successful candidates may be provided with the copies of reports of examiners who recommended for the award of the degree on payment of the prescribed fee. The reports will not disclose the identity of the examiners.
27. The candidates who have been already registered for Ph.D. Degree under the repealed Ordinance will continue to be governed by the Provisions of the repealed Ordinance.
The candidates who have applied for registration but have not been registered till this Ordinance comes into force shall be governed by the provisions of this Ordinance.
28. On detection of any irregularity, the University shall take suitable steps to withdraw the degree as per provisions of section 6 (12) of the Adhiniyam.

ORDINANCE NO. - 46

DOCTOR OF LETTERS / SCIENCE / LAWS

The degree assigned to various faculties are as detailed below-

- D.Litt. : Arts., Social Sciences, Education, Commerce, Management and Physical Education.
D.Sc.: Science, Engineering, Medicine, Ayurved, Home Science, Life Science and Technology.
LL.D. Laws.

1/ A candidate shall be eligible for registration for the degree of Doctor of Letters/ Science/ Laws if he/ she holds the degree of Doctor of Philosophy of atleast five years standing of this university or any university / deemed university - recognised by this university and must have published atleast 10 papers in standard research journals or published work including books of high standard adjudged to be equivalent to published research papers by the Research Degree Committee.

2/ The D.Litt / D.Sc. / LL.D. degree shall be awarded on the basis of an original work embodied in the thesis submitted by the candidate along with atleast three independent research papers published in standard journals or publications of merit on the subject of the thesis.

3/ A candidate for D.Litt / D. Sc. / LL.D Degree must apply for registration of his subject on the prescribed application form obtainable on payment of prescribed fee, stating:

- (i) his qualification and experience.,
- (ii) subject in which he/she proposes to work,
- (iii) the topic of research.

The application shall also be accompanied by:

- (a) Registration fee of Rs. 500.00
- (b) A certificate from the Head of the University Teaching Department/School of studies/Principal of the college affiliated to the University/Head of a Research Institute recognised for the purpose by the University, testifying that adequate facilities exist and shall be no supervisor of the candidate and he/she shall have to work independently.
Provided that a candidate, if he/she so desires, may have person(s) of merit in the subject as advisor(s)
- (c) Attested copies of the statements of marks of graduate and master's degree examinations and Ph.D. degree.
- (d) Migration certificate along with enrolment form and the requisite fee.

- (e) - List of publications of the candidate together with a copy of each of the publications.
- (f) Ten typed copies of detailed synopsis of the proposed topic of research furnishing present state-of-arts, a review of literature; proposed line of investigation with detailed methodology and relevant bibliography. (App-1)
- (g) Application for registration may be submitted any time during the academic year.

4/ The application of the candidate for registration shall be placed before the Research Degree Committee and he/she shall make an oral presentation of the proposed work.

The committee shall consist of the following:

- (i) The Kulpati,
 - (ii) The senior most Professor of the University in the subject.
 - (iii) Dean of the Faculty.
 - (iv) Head of the University Teaching Department/School of Studies, of the concerned subject, if any.
 - (v) Chairman, Board of Studies in the subject.
 - (vi) Two external experts of the concerned field of the rank of University Professor to be appointed by the Kulpati from the panel of atleast four names given by the Dean of the Faculty after perusal of the detailed synopsis submitted by the candidate.
- Two External subject experts and two other members i.e. four in all shall form the quorum.

5/ The meeting of Research Degree Committee shall be held in the University Office.

The committee shall recommend suitability of the topic of research and the registration of the candidate for the D.Litt./D.Se./LL.D.Degree, as the case may be. On approval by the committee, the candidate shall be deemed to have been registered from the date of the meeting or the date of the submission of application in the University at the discretion of the candidate.

6/ The candidate shall finally be enrolled on payment of the first term fee to University and /or recognised centre or the college affiliated to the University where he / she is pursuing research. The fee shall have to be paid every six months..

Further extension of one year may be granted by the Kulpati on valid reason(s) on payment of a fee of Rs. 300.00 to the University. After the expiry of this period of extension the registration shall be cancelled.

The Registrar shall arrange for an oral presentation of work by the candidate before a Screening Committee consisting of the following members :

 - (iii) Dean of the Faculty.
 - (iv) Head of the University Teaching Department/School of Studies in the subject, if any.
 - (v) Chairman, Board of Studies of the subject.
 - (vi) One external subject expert nominated by the Kulpati preferably from amongst the experts of R.D.C. approving the registration of the candidate.
- One external subject expert and two other members shall form the quorum for this purpose.
The presentation shall be made at the place and time fixed by the University.

(b) The Screening Committee shall have following powers:

- (i) To approve the work for the submission of thesis.
- (ii) To suggest modifications, if any alongwith reason(s) to be recorded by the committee.

(c) The presentation by the candidate shall be open to all interested and shall be announced on the Notice Board atleast a week in advance by the Registrar.

11/ The Registrar shall obtain from the external expert of the Screening Committee a panel of atleast six names including foreign experts in the subject, not below the rank of University Professor who can be appointed examiners, in a sealed envelope for the consideration of Examination Committee constituted U/s 44 of the Adhinyam.

12/ After being permitted by the Screening Committee referred to above, the candidate shall submit four typewritten copies or photo copies of the thesis, six copies of approved synopsis and six copies of summary together with an examination fee of Rs. 800.00. The published papers/works must be incorporated either as a part of text or as appendix in the thesis. The candidate shall furnish a certificate to the effect that the work embodied in the thesis has not been submitted for the award of any degree either of this university or any other university or deemed university and that it contains his own work. (app.2).

13/ (a) On receipt of the thesis the Registrar shall call upon the Examination Committee constituted u/s 44 of the Adhinyam to draw a panel of six names, taking into consideration the panel submitted by the expert of the screening committee, of the experts in the field of research not below the rank of University Professor, including foreign experts.

(b) The Kulpati shall appoint three examiners in accordance with the provisions of the Adhinyam.

(c) The examiners appointed by the Kulpati shall be approached in writing for their consent to evaluate the thesis together with the copies of approved synopsis and the summary of the thesis. On receiving the acceptance the thesis shall be sent to the examiners.

Provided that if a foreign examiner is appointed by the Kulpati and the candidate wishes the thesis to be sent by AIR MAIL he/she shall have to bear the charges of AIRMAIL.

(d) In the event of the report of the thesis not received within three months from the date of despatch of the thesis, the Kulpati may cancel the appointment and such examiner shall be asked to return the thesis along with all the documents. The Kulpati shall appoint another examiner in place of such an examiner.

14/ The examiner may seek clarification of the subject matter of the thesis from the candidate through the Registrar. The Registrar shall pass on the queries to the candidate without disclosing the identity of the examiner and the clarification obtained from the candidate shall be forwarded to the examiner. - (v) The examiner must also furnish a detailed report on the thesis together with a set of questions to be asked at the time of Viva-Voce examination. (App-3)
- (vi) In case, the examiner suggests for an improvement of thesis, he must give a detailed report on the lines on which the thesis be modified and re-submitted.

- (i) If all the three examiners approve the thesis, the candidate shall be called upon to appear at the viva-voce examination as per the provisions of the Ordinance.
 - (ii) If two examiners approve the thesis and the third rejects / recommends revision, the thesis shall sent to a fourth examiner (without the reports of earlier examiners) appointed by the Kulpati for evaluation. The opinion of the fourth examiner shall be final.

In case one of the examiners of the revised thesis recommends for the award then the candidate shall be called upon to appear at viva-voce examination.

In case both the examiners reject or one rejects, and the other recommend for revision or both recommend for revision the thesis shall be rejected.

The examiners may also ask question beyond the scope of the thesis in order to satisfy themselves that the candidate has adequate knowledge for the subject on which he has submitted the thesis.

(iv) In case of divergence of opinion between the thesis examiners and viva-voce examiners or the divergence of opinion between the viva-voce examiner the candidate shall be asked to reappear at a second viva-voce examination within six months. He shall have to pay an additional fee of Rs. 400.00 for second viva-voce. If the candidate fails to satisfy the viva-voce examiners at the second examination, his thesis shall finally be rejected.

18. After the viva-voce examination the recommendations shall be reported to the Executive council for approval. After the approval of Executive council for the award of D.Litt/D.Sc./LL.D. degree to the candidate, one copy of the thesis shall be kept in the University Library, another in the library of the Institution where he/she Prosecuted his/her research work, and the remaining two copies shall be returned to the candidate.

19. After the declaration of the result, the successful candidate on payment of a fee of Rs. 150.00 may be provided the copies of reports of the examiner without disclosing their names.

20. The candidates who have already been registered for D.Litt/D.Sc./L.D. Degree under the repealed Ordinance will continue to be governed by the Provisions of the repealed Ordinance.

21. The candidate who have applied for registration but have not been registered till this Ordinance comes into force shall be governed by the provisions of this Ordinance.

22. On detection of any irregularity, the University shall take suitable steps to withdraw the degree as per provisions of section 6 (12) of the Adhinyam.

ORDINANCE NO. 48
SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR THE PERIOD OF EMERGENCY

1. During the period of operation of the proclamation of Emergency issued under clause (1) of Article 352 of the Constitution. Ordinance No. 1 relating to students' Union in colleges and Teaching Departments and Ordinance No. 2 relating to University students Union shall have effect subject to the amendments specified in paragraphs 2 and 3 below :

Provided that, notwithstanding the Expiry of the Emergency, a member of the Executive Committee of the Students Union and the University students Union shall continue in office under the operation of this paragraph until his successor enters upon his office or 30th April whichever is earlier.

2. In Ordinance No. 1 -

(i) for paragraph 5, the following paragraphs shall be substituted; namely-

5: (i) The students Union shall have an executive Committee consisting of the following, namely :-

- (i) The President
- (ii) The Vice-President
- (iii) The Secretary
- (iv) The Joint Secretary, and

(v) Not more than seven other members of whom atleast one shall be a girl student, if no girl student is a member under any of the foregoing items and the institution has girl students on its rolls.

(ii) The members of the Executive Committee shall be nominated by the Patron from among students of the College, Teaching Department/School of studies as the case may be, in consultation with a Committee consisting of three senior most heads of department/School of studies as the case may be, in consultation with a Committee consisting of three senior most heads of departments in the Institution and the Professor-in-charge of the Union.

Provided that a student shall not be nominated if he is disqualified for membership of the Executive Committee under paragraph 5-A.

(iii) The President and the Secretary shall be nominated on the basis of academic and overall performance subject to the condition that a person eligible to be a voter for election under item (xxi) or (xxii) of subsection (d) of Section 20 shall not be nominated as the President. The President shall, ordinarily, be a student of the highest class in the institution concerned.

(iv) Members other than the president and the secretary shall be nominated on the basis of academic excellence, talent for literary/cultural activities or outstanding performance in games and sports.

(v) The term of the Executive Committee shall commence on the date of its constitution and end on the last day of April in the academic session in which it is constituted.

5-A. A student shall be disqualified for membership of the Executive Committee if he -

(a) has passed the Higher secondary Examination earlier than seven years or his Intermediate Examination earlier than six years before the opening date of the

academic session in which the nomination is made or has taken more than the prescribed minimum period of time, for whatever reason, for the course of which he is a student;

(b) has failed to pay the tuition and other fees or dues;

(c) has been convicted by a Court of Law for any offence or against whom any criminal proceeding involving moral turpitude are pending in a Court of Law;

(d) has been punished for use of unfair means at any examination;

(e) has been punished by the Head of the Institution under paragraph 13 of Ordinance No. 7;

(f) is in service in a College under the University while studying in the College, Teaching Department or School of studies;"

(ii) in paragraph 6-

(a) in sub-paragraph (a) the words "the General Council or" shall be omitted;

(b) Sub paragraph (b) shall be omitted

(c) in sub-paragraph (d) the words "the General Council or" shall be omitted;

(d) in sub-paragraph (e) the words "the General Council or" occurring twice and the words "as the case may be" shall be omitted and

(e) in sub-paragraph (f), the words "The General council or" occurring twice and the words "respectively" shall be omitted;

(iii) for paragraph 7, the following paragraph shall be substituted, namely:-

7. (a) The Professor-in-charge of the Union shall be appointed by the patron from amongst the teachers of the College, Teaching Department or school of studies, as the case may be. The Professor-in-charge shall also be the Treasurer of the Union and he shall have the right to be present at any meeting of the Executive Committee and to offer his advice on any matter relating to the Union.

(b) The professor-in-charge shall have the following powers namely :-

(i) to approve the budget of the Union,

(ii) to exercise general supervision over the affairs of the Union and to advise the Executive Committee in regard to its activities;

(iii) to authorise meetings of the Executive Committee;

(iv) to be in charge of the funds of the Union and to ensure that no part thereof is spent without proper authority or for purpose other than those for which they are allocated; and

(v) to bring to the notice of the Patron any resolution or proceedings or act of the Executive Committee or any of the office bearers of the Union which is violative of the Provisions of the Ordinances or is likely to be prejudicial to the interests of the College/Teaching Department/ School of studies, as the case may be.

(iv) in paragraph 8 -

(a) in-sub-paragraph (i) the words "the General Council and shall be omitted; and

(b) in sub-paragraph (ii) the words "the General Council" and "the General Council or" shall be omitted;

(v) in paragraph 10, the words "the General Council and" wherever they occur shall be omitted;

(vi) paragraph 12 shall be omitted:

(vii) for paragraphs 14 and 15 the following paragraphs shall be substituted, namely-

- 14 (i) The Executive Committee shall have the power-
- (a) to prepare and finalise the budget of the Union subject to the approval of the Professor-in-charge, and
 - (b) to draw up the programme of work to be undertaken by the Union during the academic year and to make necessary arrangements for implementing the programme with the approval of the Professor-in-charge
- Provided that no outsider shall be invited to address the Union or any body constituted by it without the prior permission of the Patron
- (ii) For organising the activities of the Union, the Executive committee shall have the power, with the approval of the Professor-in-charge, to appoint subcommittees consisting of its own members or other student members of the Union or both and to name Programme Secretaries for special purposes from amongst its own members or the other student members of the Union.

15 (i) Funds placed at the disposal of the Union by the Governing Body/Principal of the college or the Executive Council of the University together with any donations raised by the members of the Union with the permission of the Patron shall constitute the Fund of the union.

(ii) The Professor-in-charge shall draw out of the fund money as sanctioned by the Executive Committee for the purpose of the Union.

(iii) Where any amount is paid to the President or any other member of the Executive Committee authorised to receive the amount from the Treasurer, account shall be rendered to the secretary who shall countersign the vouchers, maintain the accounts of the Union and submit at the end of each month of accounts with complete vouchers to the Professor-in-charge."

(viii) Paragraphs 16 and shall be omitted; and

(ix) for paragraph 18, the following paragraph shall be substituted, namely :-

18. When any student having nominated as a member of the Executive Committee subsequently becomes subject to any of the disqualifications specified in paragraph 5-A such student shall automatically cease to be a member of the Executive Committee and the vacancy shall be filled by nomination by the Patron for the unexpired term of his predecessor."

3. In ordinance No. 2 :-

(i) for paragraph 6, the following paragraph shall be substituted, namely :-

6. (a) The University students Union shall have an Executive Committee consisting of the following, namely

- (i) The President
- (ii) The Vice-President
- (iii) The Secretary
- (iv) The joint secretary, and
- (v) Not more than five other members.

(b) The members of the Executive committee of the University students Union shall

- be nominated from amongst the Presidents of College Unions by the Kulati in consultation with the Adviser-cum-Treasurer and two Deans of Faculties appointed by the Kulati for this purpose.
- (c) The names of the Presidents of College Unions shall be communicated to the Adviser-cum-Treasurer before the last date to be fixed by the Kulati. The Kulati shall make the nominations under (b) above from amongst the names communicated before the last date so fixed.
- (d) The term of the Executive Committee of the University students Union shall commence on the date of its constitution and end on the last day of April in the academic session in which it is constituted.
- (ii) Paragraphs 7, 8, 9 and sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 10 shall be omitted;
- (iii) for paragraph 11, the following paragraph shall be substituted, namely :-
 "11. The executive Committee of the University students Union shall have the Power -
 (a) to draw up detailed schemes to be implemented and to take steps to implement them;
 (b) to prepare the budget and to finalise it with the approval of the Adviser-cum-Treasurer;
 (c) to allot duties to its members and to constitute, with the approval of the Adviser-cum-Treasurer, sub-committees for specific purposes consisting of its own member or members of College Unions or both and appoint Programme Secretaries for specific purposes."
- (iv) In paragraph 12 :-
 (a) In sub-paragraph (a) the words "the council or" shall be omitted;
 (b) sub-paragraph (b) shall be omitted;
 (c) in sub-paragraph (d), the words "the council or" shall be omitted.
 (d) in sub-paragraph (e), the words "the council or" occurring twice and the words "as the case may be" shall be omitted; and
 (e) in sub-paragraph (f), the words, "the council or" occurring twice shall be omitted
- (v) in paragraph 13,-
 (a) Sub-paragraph (i) the words "the Council and" shall be omitted;
 (b) in sub-paragraph (ii) the words "the Council and" and "the council or" shall be omitted;
- (vi) In paragraph 14 -
 (a) In sub-paragraph (i), the words "the Council and" shall be omitted.
 (b) in sub paragraph (ii), the words "the Council and" and "the Council or" shall be omitted.
- (vii) In paragraph 16.-
 (a) in sub-paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iv) the words "the Council and" shall be omitted; and
 (b) in sub-paragraph (v) the words "the Council or" shall be omitted; and
- (viii) Paragraph 19 shall be omitted.

REVISED ORDINANCE - 52
PT. RAVISHANKAR SHUKLA UNIVERSITY, RAIPUR,
CHHATTISGARH

MASTER OF PHILOSOPHY

(As approved by the Co-ordination Committee at its meeting dated
DD/MM/YYYY)

1. This ordinance comes into force with immediate effect.
2. The Degree of Master of Philosophy shall be abbreviated as M.Phil.
3. (a) A candidate will be eligible for admission to the M.Phil. course if he/she holds a Master's Degree of this University or any other University recognized as equivalent thereto with at least 55% marks. A relaxation of 5% is provided from 55% to 50% of the marks at the Master level for the SC, ST, Differently Aabled category (Approved by the Co-ordination Committee dated 22-07-06).

All candidates should also have at least 50% marks at the UG level.

- (b) A candidate may be admitted to the M.Phil. course in the subject which he/she studied for his/her Master's degree or in allied subjects.

4. (a) In each of the post graduate teaching departments, running the M.Phil. course, there shall be an M.Phil. Committee comprising such teachers of the Department or of an allied department as may be associated with the course/ research programs. An external expert may also be co-opted to this committee at the discretion of the Kulapati. The Head of the Department shall be the Chairman of the Committee.

- (b) The M.Phil. Committee shall perform the following functions:

- (i) To recommend the name of the students for admission to the M.Phil. course.
- (ii) To draw the syllabus for the M.Phil. Course for the consideration of the Board of Studies (Joint Meeting of the M.Phil. Committees of the Departments concerned be held for the formulation of interdisciplinary M.Phil. Courses).
- (iii) To recommend names of supervisors of M.Phil. candidates and to assign topic for dissertation.

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- (iv) To plan and organize seminars, group discussion etc.
 - (v) To propose names of internal examiners for evaluation of seminars.
 - (vi) To propose a panel of three examiners for each course/ dissertation for the consideration of the Examination Committee.
 - (vii) Any other function assigned to it by the Kulapati.
5. (a) Admission to the M.Phil. Course shall be made through an Entrance Test conducted by the University.
- (b) Admission to the Course shall be made subject to the approval of the M.Phil. Committee.
- (c) A supervisor shall not have, at any given point of time, more than five M.Phil. students.
6. The duration of the M.Phil. Course shall be one academic year.
7. (a) The M.Phil. examination shall follow the following patterns :

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- (c) The third theory course shall be applicable to the subjects that do not have lab courses.
- (d) The assessment of the Seminars shall be done by the internal examiners. The assessment of the practical records, carrying 20 marks shall be done at the time of the annual examination jointly by the internal and external examiners.
- (e) The result will be computed by combining the marks of the various courses and the dissertation.

8. A candidate will be required to submit three typed copies of his/ her dissertation within a month after the completion of theory examination. The dissertation and Viva-Voce shall be valued by both internal and external examiners. A declaration (Appendix-1) by the candidate and a certificate (Appendix-2) from the Supervisor/ Co-supervisors shall be included in the dissertation.

9. The evaluation of the seminar on the dissertation will be done internally by the supervisor and at least one other teacher connected with the course.

10. (a) In order to pass the M.Phil. examination a candidate will be required to obtain a minimum of 48% of marks both in the aggregate of theory, practical, seminars and dissertation, separately.

(b) Candidates obtaining 60% or higher marks, but below 75%, in overall aggregate of all course and dissertation will be declared as passed with merit.

(c) Candidate obtaining 75% or higher marks in overall aggregate of all course and dissertation will be declared as passed with distinction.

11. A candidate for the M.Phil. degree shall not be permitted to join any other course of study or to appear at any other examinations conducted by a University or any other agency, except a language diploma/ certificate course run by the University.

12. On publication of the whole or part of the M.Phil. dissertation, it may be indicated in the published work that it has been accepted for M.Phil. degree of this University.

13. Rate of Remuneration payable to the examiners of M.Phil. examination shall be as prescribed in the General Examination Ordinance.

14. An M.Phil. candidate shall be required to pay the fees as decided by the University from time to time.

15. In matters of admission, enrolment, attendance, examination and in all other matters not provided for by this ordinance, the M.Phil. course will be

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governed by the general provisions of the relevant ordinances in so far as they are in consistence with the explicit provisions of the ordinance.

16. The details, where necessary, may be prescribed by the Regulation framed under the Ordinance.
17. (a) Candidates failing in the M.Phil. examination shall be eligible to re-appear as ex-students. They will be exempted from the re-examination of their dissertation/ seminar/ practical that they have cleared. The marks obtained by them will be carried over for determining their results.
(b) If the candidate fails to submit dissertation within the prescribed date, he/she will be allowed to submit dissertation next year. The marks obtained by him/ her in theory, practical and seminar will be carried over for determining the result.

18. Submission of Electronic copy of the Thesis/ Dissertation (ETD) is mandatory at the time of submission of the M.Phil. thesis/ dissertation (Appendix-3). The University shall submit a soft copy to the UGC within a period of 30 days after the award of the degree, for hosting the same in INFLIBNET, accessible to all Institutions /Universities.

Note: In order to ensure uniformity of standards, the M.Phil. Committee, when performing their functions under Clause 4(b)(ii), may liaise with such committees in other Universities, so that the topics and standards of course prescribed under Clause 7(a) are not very dissimilar especially where the same specializations have been selected by two or more Universities.

ORDINANCE No. 53

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT AND TRANSITORY PROVISION FOR CONVERSION FOR GRADE POINTS INTO MARKS

1. This ordinance shall apply in case of M.A., M.Sc. and M.Com. Previous Examinations of 1979 and thereafter and M.A., M.Sc. and M.Com. Final Examinations of 1980 and thereafter.

Provided that the provisions of para 16 shall come into force from 1st June, 1978.

2. (a) Notwithstanding any thing contained in any other ordinance relating to examinations, the provisions of this ordinance shall be applicable to all regular students of the University Teaching Departments and all affiliated colleges in regard to the Post-graduate courses enumerated above.

(b) The provisions of the relevant examination ordinary———where they are contrary to the provisions of this———shall apply unless directed otherwise by the Kulpati, in consultation with the Standing Committee of the Academic Council.

3. (a) Under the new scheme for purposes of Internal Assessment, the prescribed courses will be divided into four teaching units. The achievements of students will be assessed therein through atleast four periodical tests, spread over the session in each theory paper.

At the end of the session there shall be an Annual University Examination in all papers in the entire prescribed course.

(b) The answers to questions in both the Internal Assessment and the Annual University examination will be valued by the teachers and examiners concerned by awarding marks.

(c) The results of two tests out of four to the best advantage of the examinee will be counted for determining his performance in Internal Assessment.

(d) There shall be no choice in the questions given for the internal tests.

(e) Internal tests shall be held on the dates notified by the Principal/teacher concerned.

4. (a) Ordinarily not more than 50 percent of the examiners of the Annual University examination shall be external.

In case of practicals, projects, dissertations the examination shall form a part of the Annual University Examination and shall be conducted by a joint board of external and internal examiners. There shall be no separate internal assessment in case of practicals, project and dissertation.

- (b) There shall be no viva-voce examination in subjects not having practicals. In case of subjects having practicals, the viva-voce examination shall form a part of the practicals.

5. The relevant weightage of internal assessment and the annual university examination in case of each paper in which internal assessment is provided for, shall be in the ratio of 1: 9 (i.e. 10% for the internal assessment and 90% for the university examinations).

6. (a) The marks obtained in the Internal Assessment and the Annual university Examination will be shown separately card, but added together for determining the division in which an examinee is placed.

In M.A/ M.Sc. and M.Com. examinations the examinees should separately score atleast 36% marks in University assessment.

- (b) In the case of an ex-student, his previous marks for internal assessment shall be carried forward.

7. A student who has passed the examination, and who is desirous of improving his division subsequently shall be permitted to do so, under the provision existing in the ordinances relating to examination concerned.

Provided that for purposes of such attempt at improvement, the marks obtained in internal assessment shall be carried over from the original examination.

The syllabi for a candidate appearing for improvement of division shall be the same as prescribed for the year in which he appears in the examination for such improvement.

8. The university shall institute, from time to time, sample checking of scripts of internal assessment for evaluation purposes. Awards at internal assessment may be moderated by a Board appointed by the Kulpati. For this purposes the answer papers of internal

tests shall be forwarded to the university immediately after the internal tests along with the award list. Where the award is altered by the Board, the award of marks by the Board shall be taken as final.

9. Any representation against the internal assessment by the teacher concerned shall be made within five days of the declaration of the result to the Head of the University Department/Principal of the college, who shall place the matter before a Review Committee consisting of the Head of the University Department/Principal of the college, the teacher concerned and one more teacher competent to assess the script, co-opted by him (Head of the University Department/Principal of the college). The decision taken by the Committee shall be final, unless altered subsequently by the Board referred to in the foregoing paragraph.

10. Each test for internal assessment will ordinarily be of 45 minutes duration. The number of questions will be determined by the teachers concerned. The teachers could give short objective type questions, multiple choice tests, open book tests, problem oriented exercises, quizzes, etc. The tests will be held in the teaching periods allotted to the teachers. Each test shall carry 25 marks.

11. Where one paper is being taught by more than one teacher, they would hold the test together in one period to be decided jointly, the candidates answering portions relating to different teachers on separate sheets, and the marks obtained will be co-ordinated by the senior teacher and submitted by him after getting it signed by —

12. The students will be shown the answer papers after evaluation and will have a chance to discuss the marks obtained with the teachers concerned. The students will have to return the answer papers after perusal and these will be kept in the custody of the Head of the University Department/Principal of the college concerned for 15 days after the declaration of the results of the test, and sent to the university examination section thereafter together with the award list.

13. The teacher will prepare three copies of the results of each test in the prescribed proforma (Appendix- B) and submit two copies to the Head of the University Department/Principal of the college (within six days of the test) and keep one for his

own record. The Head of the University Department/Principal of the college will, in turn, send on the expiry of the fifteen days mentioned above, one copy to the Registrar of the University and keep the other for his record. A consolidated statement showing separately the awards at all tests and the aggregate of the awards at two tests to the best advantage of the student will be sent to the Registrar of the University by the Head of the Department/Principal within one month of the declaration of the awards of the last test.

14. The Kulpati may take such action as he deems necessary to remove difficulties that may arise in the implementation of this ordinance.

15. Transitory Provision: - The grade points and over all grade points awarded at the M.A., M.Sc. and M.Com. Previous examination 1977 as per repealed ordinance No. 49, will be converted into marks according to the Conversion Table enclosed at Appendix - A, and added to the marks obtained at the M.A., M.Sc. and M.Com. Final Examination of 1978 or thereafter for determining the division in which an examinee placed.
