

ORDINANCE No. 72

MASTER OF ENGINEERING IN "WATER RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT AND IRRIGATION ENGINEERING"

For Master of Engineering in Water Resources Development and Irrigation Engineering (Civil Engg.), Master of Engineering in Energy System & Pollution (Mech. Engg.), M.E. in Chemical Process Design and M.Tech. (Computer Technology)

1. The course of study shall be of 3 semesters extending over period of 1-1/2 (one and a half) years as per the prescribed syllabus.

2. At the end of each semester, there shall be two examinations, the main examination and compartmental examination for each of the following examinations:-

- (a) At the end of 1st semester-Master of Engineering (1st Semester) Examination.
- (b) At the end of 2nd semester-Master of Engineering (2nd Semester) Examination
- (c) At the end of 4th semester - Master of Engineering (Final) Examination

3. The Examination shall be conducted by means of written theory papers, Practical examination, sessional work and project work.

4. A candidate who after passing the Bachelor of Engineering examination in Civil Engineering M.Tech., Engg. Chemical Engg. or equivalent examination including AMIE recognized by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, has prosecuted a regular course of study in Engineering College affiliated to the University, for one academic semester, shall be eligible for appearing at the Master of Engineering (1st Semester) Examination.

5. A candidate who after passing the Master of Engineering (1st semester) Examination of the University, has prosecuted a regular course of study in an Engineering College affiliated to the University for one academic semester, shall be eligible for appearing at the Master of Engineering (2nd semester) Examination.

6. A candidate who, after passing Master of Engineering (2nd semester) Examination of the University, has prosecuted a regular course of study in an Engineering College affiliated to the University for one academic semester, shall be eligible for appearing at the Master of Engineering (Final Semester) Examination.

Explanation:-

Successful prosecution of regular course of study means:-

That he has attended requisite number of lectures and practicals held during the semester.

7. A candidate shall be admitted to the degree of Master of Engineering after passing the Master of Engineering (Final semester) Examination.

8. Each candidate for Master of Engineering Examination shall be examined in the subjects as mentioned in the course of studies to be prescribed for each examination of the semester.

9. In order to pass at any of the Three M.E. Examinations, examinee must obtain not less than:-

- i) 40% of total marks in each paper and,
- ii) 50% of total marks in each practical/project work and
- iii) 60% of total marks in each sessional and
- iv) 50% of total aggregate marks.

10. (a) An unsuccessful examinee who has failed in not more than one theory paper or one practical shall be placed in compartment in such theory paper or practical, A candidate shall be declared successful at the examination if he obtains at a subsequent examination the prescribed minimum pass marks in such theory/Practical in which he has been placed in the compartment and also secures the prescribed minimum aggregate marks for passing.

- (b) If a candidate fails to obtain the prescribed minimum of 50% marks in total aggregate but passes in all theory papers, practicals, sessionals, he shall also be

placed in the compartment in not more than one theory paper of his choice. The candidate will be declared successful if he secures adequate marks in the subject of his choice in the compartmental examination so as to make up the total aggregate to a minimum of 50%.

(c) A compartmental candidate who fails in category 10 (a) and (b) above shall be allowed maximum of two more attempts in the examination.

(d) A candidate who fails to clear compartmental subject of M.E.-I semester Examination shall not be eligible to take admission in M.E. III semester class.

11. A candidate who fails in M.E.-I semester examination shall cease to be a student of M.E. course, and shall not be allowed to appear in any of the semester examination.

12. If a candidate fails to secure the minimum pass Marks in the sessionals for shall be debarred from appearing in M.E. examination.

13. Notwithstanding any thing contained in this ordinance a candidate who is placed in compartment in accordance with the provision of para (10) above, shall be provisionally admitted to next higher class, provided he has prosecuted a regular course of study in next higher class for one academic semester, he will also be permitted provisionally to appear at the next higher class examination in all subjects and practical in addition to appearing in the lower class examination in compartmental subjects. However, in case he fails to clear the compartmental subject, of the lower class his result of higher class examination will be announced as usual, but according to para 10-(d) he will not be eligible to seek admission to the next higher class until he clears the compartmental subject of lower class.

14. The division for the Master of Engg. Degree shall be awarded on the following basis

50% and above but less than 65% of total aggregate Marks	II Divn.
65% and above but not less than 75% of total aggregate marks	I Divn.
75% and above of the total aggregate marks	I Divn. with Honours.

For the purpose of award of division the total aggregate marks will be taken as total of marks obtained in all the three semester examinations.

Revised Ordinance No. 73

Basic B.Sc. Nursing

1. The degree shall be known as Bachelor of Science in Nursing.
2. This Ordinance is subject to alteration from time to time.
3. The Ordinance shall be subject to provision of the University Act & Statutes in force from time to time.
4. The admission etc. for 2005-2006 and onwards will be governed by first Ordinance 73.

Duration

5. Duration of the course shall be of four years including internship.

Eligibility for Admission

1. The minimum age for admission shall be 17-24 years on before 1st July of the year of admission. In case of ST/SC and OBC candidates' age will be relaxed for 5 years.
2. The minimum educational requirement shall be the passing of:-
 - a. Senior School Certificate Examination (10+2), Pre-degree Examination. With Science subjects & English.
 - b. An equivalent with 12 years schooling from a recognized Board or University with science (Physics, Chemistry, Biology) and English with minimum 50% aggregate marks (P.C.B.E.)
3. Candidate shall be medically fit.

Entrance/ Selection

Selection of the candidates should be based on the merit of entrance examination held by competent authority or University.

Enrollment

On admission each student is required to get her/ him enrolled to the R.S.S. University, Raipur Student of other university have to submit the Migration Certificate

alongwith enrollment forms, failing which candidates will not be enrolled as students of Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur.

University Examinations

1. Minimum pass marks shall be 50% in each of the theory and practical papers separately.
2. Minimum pass marks shall be 40% for English only.
3. A candidate must have minimum of 80% Attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence in theory and practical) in each subject for appearing for Examination.
4. A candidate must have 100% Attendance in each of the practical areas before award of degree.
5. If the candidate fails in either theory or practical paper he/she has to reappear for both the papers (theory and practical) of that subject.
6. Maximum number of attempts permitted for failing subject/subjects is 3 including first attempt. It means two more supplementary.

7. Five grace marks will be given to the candidate who fails in one subject only in annual exam.
7. Annual Examination shall be conducted in May every year.
8. Supplementary shall be held in September and in May with regular examination.
10. Candidates shall not be admitted to the subsequent higher Examination unless the candidate has passed the previous examination.
11. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years.
12. The maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceed 20 students per day, it must be held in the respective clinical areas.
13. One internal and one external examiners should jointly conduct practical Examination for each student.
14. An Examiner should be a lecturer or above in a college of nursing with M.Sc. (Nursing) in concerned subject and minimum of 3 years of teaching experience. To be an examiner for nursing foundations course faculty having M.Sc. (Nursing) with any specialty shall be considered.
15. Theory and practical exams for Introduction to computer & English to be conducted as College exam and marks to be sent to the University for inclusion in the Mark sheet.
16. Anatomy question paper section "A" of 37 marks and Physiology should be of 38 marks.

17. Nutrition question paper section "A" consist 45 marks and Biochemistry of 30 marks.
18. Section "A" of Pharmacology with 38 marks. Section "B" of Pathology of 25 marks and Genetics with 12 marks.
19. Nursing Research "A" section should be of 50 marks and section "B" Statistics of 25 marks.
20. In other subjects "A" Section will have 38 marks and "B" Section will have 37 marks.
21. Fourth year final Examination to be held only after completing the Internship.
22. Internal assessment 25 marks for all the theory subjects will be given by the respective colleges and for practical 50/100, marks

Result

1. The successful candidates shall be classified every year's marks, which they obtain in the annual examination.
2. In final year (Fourth year) the successful candidates shall be classified on the aggregate Marks obtain in all the four-year examinations taken together.
 - a. Those who obtain 75% or more marks in a subject or in aggregate marks will have **DISTINCTION**.
 - b. A candidate for the degree of Bachelor of Nursing who has completed her/his course appeared in each of her/his yearly examination and has obtained aggregate of seventy five percent of the maximum marks in all the year examination, shall at the time of graduation she/ he will be awarded the degree of B.Sc. (Nursing) with "HONOURS".
 - c. Those who obtain 60 -74% will have First Division.
 - d. Those who obtain 50-59% shall be awarded Second Division.
 - e. When Result is declared the Division and distinction shall be mentioned in News Paper and in the Mark sheet.

ORDINANCE No. 74

MASTER OF LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE COURSE (M.Lib.I.Sc.)

I. Candidates seeking admission to the course should satisfy the following conditions.

(a) They must possess the postgraduate Dip. Lib. Sc./B. Lib. Sc. of the University, or a post graduate Diploma in Library Science/B. Lib. Sc. of any other University, recognized by the Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University of Raipur, as equivalent to the B. Lib. Sc. Provided that such a candidate has obtained a second class with a minimum of 50 percent marks.

(b) In addition, they should pass an admission test in Library classification and library cataloguing, conducted by the department of Library and Information Science, with a minimum of 50% marks in each subject.

Note: (1) Those who have obtained the B. Lib. Sc. degree of the University within the last 3 years are exempted from this test.

(2) After preliminary screening of admission applications only a select number of candidates will be called for the Admission Test.

(c) They must fulfill other condition as may be laid down by the Library Science Course Admission Committee from time to time.

II. Candidates seeking admission to this course must have attained the age of 20 years on or before 1st Oct. in the year in which admission is sought.

III. In all cases of admission the decision of the Lib.Sc. Courses Admission Committee shall be final.

Foreign Candidates

Applications of these candidates will be considered by the Admission Committee on the basis of individual merit.

Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes.

Candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes will form a separate category for admission and will be required to furnish evidence of belonging to a Scheduled Caste or Tribes. Under this category there will be reservations of 22.1/2% of seats in each of the B. Lib. Sc. & M. L. I. Sc. courses 15% for Scheduled Castes and 7 1/2% for Scheduled Tribes (interchangeable). The reserved seats will be filled in order of merit categories.

Note: The Bachelor of Library Science (B. Lib. Sc.) Master of Library and Information Science (M.L.I. Sc.), and M. Phil are whole time course.

Examination and Scheme of papers:-

1. The duration of the course for the degree of Master of Library and Information Sciences shall be one academic year.
2. The course is divided into two semesters and there shall be an examination at the end of each semester as given below:

3. Marks on account of internal assessment will be assigned by the teachers in the Department. The Head of the Department will send the 'internal assessment' marks to the University at the end of each semester.

4. Medium of instructions of examination shall be English/Hindi

5. "Subject to provisions of Ordinance VII no candidate shall be deemed to have pursued a regular course of study for the academic year unless he has attended not less than 75% of the lectures, tutorials and discussion classes, taken together, hold in each semester and not less than two third of the aggregate of the lectures, tutorials and discussion classes taken together for the semester combined.

A candidate who does not fulfill the attendance requirements as above at the end of the I semester, examination and shall be required to discontinue the course forthwith

In case a candidate has put in the requisite attendance at the end of any semester, but has not been able to put in the requisite attendance in the II semester and/or in the aggregate of the II semester examination, he/she shall not be permitted to appear at the Second Semester examination. Such a candidate will have to rejoin the course in the II semester in the year immediately following, if otherwise eligible. In the following year, requisite attendance put in by such a candidate, in the I semester in the previous year and II semester of the current year will determine its eligibility to appear at the examination of II semester of the current year.

6. The pass marks required for each paper will be 36% and an aggregate of test internal assessment & these separately 50%.
7. The total of marks obtained in the first and second semester examinations will determine the classification of result, which will be as follows:

Minimum marks to secure place in the first division will be 60% and the second division 50% of the total marks.

LIBRARY TOUR

Every year the Department organizes visits to Libraries/Documentation Centres in Raipur and outside Raipur in which Students participation in generally expected.

FAILED CANDIDATES

1. A candidate who fails in one or more papers in the first semester examination or the second semester examination will be allowed to reappear in four succeeding semesters.
2. A candidate who secured 50% of more marks in any paper shall not be permitted to reappear in that paper at a subsequent examination.

ORDINANCE No. 75

MASTER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION EXAMINATION (Two Years Course)

1. The examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education shall consist of two parts:-
 - (a) The Previous Examination and
 - (b) The Final Examination.

Eligibility

2. A candidate who, after obtaining the degree of Bachelor of Physical Education of the University or an examination of any statutory University in India which has been recognised by the University as equivalent to Bachelor of Physical Education's degree of the University and has completed a regular course of study for one academic year in a teaching department of the University or in a college affiliated to the University, shall be admitted to the previous examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education. Provided that he/she shall have passed the Examination for Bachelor of Physical Education degree securing minimum 45% of marks in theory.

3. A candidate who, after passing the Master of Physical Education Previous Examination of the University, has completed a regular course of study for one Academic year in a teaching department of the University or in a College affiliated to the University shall be admitted to the Final Examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education.

A candidate, who has passed the Previous Examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education of another University, may also be admitted to the Final Examination for the degree of Master of Physical Education, after obtaining previous permission of the Kulpati on the recommendation of the Chairman of Board of Studies that he/she has offered for his Previous Examination a course of study of an equivalent standard with almost identical syllabus as is required for the Previous Examination of this University, and has attended a regular Course of study for one Academic year in a Teaching Department of the University or in a College affiliated to the University.

4. The Examination shall consist of theory, practical and Sessional as per requirement of syllabus.
5. Ex-student shall be eligible for admission to the examination as per provision of Ordinance No. 6.
6. In Order to pass at any of the Previous or Final Examinations, a candidate must obtain at least 40% marks in each written paper and practical and 50% in each Sessional work. However to pass the candidate must secure in the Examination 48% marks in aggregate.
7. The Division of the candidate shall be determined on the basis of total marks obtained in the Previous and Final Examination.
8. Candidate securing 60% or above marks shall be placed in First Division and candidate securing less than 60% marks shall be placed in the Second Division.
9. A unsuccessful Candidate appearing as Ex-student shall be allowed to carryover the Sessional marks obtained for the next examination.
In the event of candidate seeking admission as regular candidate shall not be entitled to carry over the Sessional marks.
10. A successful candidate in the Final Examination will be allowed to carry over the marks obtained in dissertation, appearing subsequently as an ex-student provided the Candidate has been successful in dissertation.
The Candidate shall submit three copies of the dissertation two weeks before the commencement of the examination, failing to which the student shall not be allowed to appear in the Examination. However the candidate may submit the said dissertation for the subsequent year.
11. The scheme of Examination and the Courses of Studies shall be as provided in the syllabus.

12. The Tuition, Examination and other fees shall be as follows:-

- (1) Yearly Tuition Fee - Rs. 400/-
- (2) Examination Fee - Rs. 75/-
- (3) Dissertation Fees, if opted for - Rs. 50/-
- (4) Yearly Gymnasium Fee - Rs. 100/-
- (5) Other fees as prescribed
by the University from time
to time.

ORDINANCE No. 76

B. ARCH. DEGREE

(TEN SEMESTER INTEGRATIVE COURSE)

1. The course of study for the degree of Bachelor of Architecture shall extend over a period of Five Years consisting of TEN semesters as per scheme of examination & syllabus prescribed.
2. Each year shall be divided into two semesters designated as odd and even semesters. Teaching for odd semesters shall normally commence in July of a academic year and for even semesters in December of the same year.
3. Fresh Admission after selection through C.E.T. conducted by V.P.P. Mandal shall be made only in the first semester, however this will not apply to those candidates whose admission are controlled by the C.G. Govt. relating to reservation.
4. Admission to odd semesters shall be given normally only in the month of July/August and the admission to the even semesters only in the months of December/January each year. In order to be eligible for admission to the next higher semester, the candidate must have appeared at the preceding semester examination. In case of serious sickness of candidate at the time of examination, admission to the next higher semester may be given provided the candidate has submitted proper Medical certificate of his sickness to the satisfaction of the Principal before commencement of examination.
5. There shall be a University examination at the end of both odd and even semesters. These examinations will normally be held during November/December for the odd semesters and April/May for even semesters.
6. At the end of each semester, there shall be full examination of all the subjects taught in the odd and even semesters. For the benefit of out going students from the college, there shall be a second examination of TENTH Semester as early as possible. After the declaration of result of tenth semester. Candidates who do not clear the ninth semester, examination will not be entitled for this second examination.

7. A candidate who does not secure the minimum of 85% of attendance in each theory subject and practical of any semester examination shall not be qualified for appearing in the ensuing examinations and shall be declared as 'Detained Candidate' for the semester. He shall be required to take readmission during the next even or odd semester as the case may be in which he has been detained and complete the academic requirements.

(i) A condonation of 10% in respect of attendance may be granted by the Principal and further condonation of 5% by the Kulpati.

(ii) Absence due to participation in NCC/NSS camps and absence due to participation as a member of College/University team in Inter-collegiate or Inter-University competitions shall be taken as full attendance.

(iii) It shall be the entire responsibility of the student to ensure that he has secured the required percentage of attendance for being eligible to appear in the examination within the specified period.

(iv) Filling of examination form, payment of exam. Fees or issue of admission card by the University shall not entitle the student to appear in the examination unless ten days before the commencement of the examination he satisfies the Principal that he has secured minimum percentage of attendance & minimum required sessional marks, to make him eligible to appearing in the examination (The sessional marks would be computed with 60% weightage for class work and 40% weightage for final submission)

8. Preparation leave of ten days shall normally be given prior to the commencement of written examination.

9. A candidate who secures at least the following percentage of marks is deemed to have passed in an examination:-

(i) 45% of full marks in each of the Theory examination

(ii) 60% of full marks in each of the Sessional/Class work.

(iii) 50% of full marks in each of the Practical Examination.

(iv) 55% of the aggregate of total marks of the complete examination.

Candidate who secures 45% in all the theory subjects 60% in all sessionals and 50% in all the Practicals of an examination but fails to secure 55% in aggregate shall be

declared fail in that semester. He shall be allowed to make up his aggregate by appearing in maximum two theory papers of his choice in the ensuing examination. Condonation of deficiency of marks upto the extent of 50% shall be awarded to the best advantage of the candidate.

10. A candidate shall be allowed to carry over all the subjects (Theory, Sessional and Practical) of a semester in the next higher semester. He shall be required to clear in the next examination, only those subjects (theory or Practical/ Viva-voce) in which he did not secure the minimum pass marks.

11. A candidate shall be eligible for admission to the Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, Ninth, and Tenth Semester provided he has passed the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Semester respectively.

12. A candidate who has appeared in the TENTH Semester but has not cleared all the subject theory, sessionals and Practicals of Eight semester shall be withheld and the marks sheet of the tenth semester shall not be issued until he clears all the subjects of ninth semester (Tenth being Practical Training Semester) in the subsequent examination.

13. The division shall be awarded to the candidates at the end of even semester except the Tenth (i.e., 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th & 10th) including the marks of the preceding odd semester.

14. The award of division for the B. Arch. Degree shall be based on the marks secured in all the semester examinations with weightage assigned as below:-

- I and II Semester 10% of total score
- III and IV Semester 10% of total score
- V and VI Semester 15% of total score
- VII and VIII Semester 15% of total score
- IX and X Semester 100% of total score

15. The award of division shall be on the following basis:-

- (i) Candidates securing 55% or more but less than 65% of the total aggregate marks shall be placed in the Second Division.

- (ii) Candidates securing 65% or more but less than 75% of the total aggregate marks shall be placed in the First Division.
- (iii) Candidates securing 75% or more of the total marks shall be placed in First Division with Honors.

16. The provisions of Ordinance 5 and 6 shall be applicable only to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.

REVISED ORDINANCE No. 77

B. E. FOUR YEAR DEGREE COURSE SEMESTER SYSTEM

1. The course of study for the degree of Bachelor of Engineering shall extend over a period for FOUR years consisting of EIGHT semesters as per schemes of Examination of syllabus prescribed.
2. Each year shall be divided into two semesters designed as odd and even semester. Teaching for odd semesters shall normally commence in July of the academic year and for even semesters in December of the same academic year.
3. Fresh admissions after selection through the combined entrance test conducted by V.P.P. Mandal shall to be made only in the first semester. However this will not apply to those candidate whose admissions are controlled by the C.G. Govt. relating to the reservations.
4. Admission to odd semester shall by given normally in the month of July/August and admission to the even semesters in the month of December/January each academic year. In order to be eligible for admission to the next higher semester the candidate must have appeared at the preceding semester examination. In case of serious sickened of candidates at the time of examination admission to the next higher semester may be given provided the candidate has submitted proper medical certificate of his sickness to the satisfaction of the principal of the College before commencement of the examination.
5. There shall be a university Examination at the end of each semester. These examinations will normally be held during November/December for the odd semester and April/May for even semester.
Each of these examinations shall be a full examination comprising of all the subjects taught in the odd and even semester. For the benefit of the outgoing students from the college there shall be a second examination of eight semester only as early as possible after the declaration of result of eighth semester, candidates who do not clear the

seventh semester examination, will not be entitled to appear at this second examination.

6. A candidate who does not secure the minimum of 85% of attendance in each theory & practical of any semester, shall be qualified for appearing in the ensuing examination and or shall be required to take re-admission during the next even or odd semester, as the case may be in which he has been detained, so as to complete the academic requirements.

(i) A condonation of 10% in respect of attendance may be granted by the principal of the college and further condonation of 5% by the Kulpati.

(ii) Absence due to participation in NCC/NSS camps and due to participation as member of the college/University team in intercollegiate or inter-university competitions shall be taken as full attendance.

(iii) It shall be the entire responsibility of the student to ensure that he has secured the required percentage of attendance for being eligible to appear in the examination within the specified period.

(iv) Filling of examination form, payment of exam. fee issue of admission card by the University shall not entitle the student to appear in examination unless ten days before the commencement of the examination he satisfies the Principal of the college that he has secured minimum percentage of attendance & minimum sessional marks.

7. Preparation leave of ten days shall normally be given prior to the commencement of written examination.

8. There shall be theory and practical examination in each semester. The minimum pass marks in each of the theory paper, practical and sessional shall be 35%, 50%, 60% respectively. To pass a semester examination an examinee shall have to secure a minimum of 50% of the total aggregate of marks. To make up the shortage in the total

aggregate of marks a candidate will be required to re-appear in not more than two theory papers of his choice.

Condonation of deficiency of marks up to the extent of 50% shall be awarded in each semester examination to the best advantage of the candidate.

9. A candidate shall be allowed to carry over all the subjects' i. e. theory and practical of a semester in the next higher semester. He shall be required to clear, in the next semester examination, in only that subject (theory and practical) in which he did not secure the minimum pass marks.

10. A candidate shall be eligible for admission to the V, VI, VII and VIII semester, provided he/she has passed the first, second, third and fourth semester respectively. But he shall be allowed to appear in any two of the three consecutive semester examination.

11. A candidate who has appeared in the Eighth semester but has not cleared all the subjects (theory and practical) of seventh semester shall not be issued unit he clears all the subjects his result shall be with held and marks sheet of eighth semester in the subsequent examinations.

12. The division shall be awarded to the candidates at the end of even semester except 8th semester i.e. 2nd, 4th, and 6th only after including the marks of the preceding odd semester.

13. The award of division for the B. E. degree i. e. after passing 8th semester shall be based on the marks secured in all the semester examination with weightage assigned as follows:

First and Second Semester: 10% of total score

Third and Fourth Semester 20% of total score

Fifth and Sixth Semester: 20% of total score

Seventh and Eighth semester - 100% of total score

14. The award of division shall be on the following basis:-

- (a) Candidates securing 50% but less than 65% of the total marks shall be placed in the SECOND division.
- (b) Candidates securing 65% but less than 75% of the total marks shall be placed in the FIRST division.
- (c) Candidates securing 75% and above of the total marks be placed in FIRST division with HONOURS.

15. The provision of Ordinance 5 and 6 shall be applicable only to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance.

ORDINANCE No. 77-A

(Approved by the Co-ordination Committee, Date 19-12-79)

ORDINANCE FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONGST THE STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY TEACHING DEPARTMENTS


(Sec. 37, C1, (viii) of the M.P.V.V. Adhiniyam, 1973)

1. All students prosecuting a course of studies at the University Teaching Departments shall observe a code of conduct as may be laid down by the Executive Council and also abide by all rules and regulations of the University framed and notified from time to time.
2. Any violation of the code of conduct or breach of any rule or regulation of the University by any student shall constitute an act of indiscipline and shall make him liable for disciplinary action against him.
3. The following acts, in particular, shall constitute acts of gross indiscipline and any student indulging in any of them shall render himself liable for disciplinary action against him:-
 - (A) Disobeying the teacher or misbehaving in the class.
 - (B) Quarrelling or fighting in any University building or in the campus among themselves.
 - (C) Quarrelling or fighting with a University employee or any employee of the University Canteen, mess or any other public utility functioning in the campus.
 - (D) Behaving in the University campus or outside in a manner which is indecent or which it meant to annoy or harass the teachers, officers or employees of the University.
 - (E) Any other act which the Discipline Committee may determine and the Kulpati may accept as an act of gross indiscipline.
 - (F) However all cases of discipline within Hostel premises that shall be dealt by the Warden concerned. To deal with such incidents the Warden shall have all the powers prescribed for the Proctor in this Ordinance.

4. There shall be a Proctorial Board consisting of a Proctor and such number of Joint Proctors as the Executive Council may decide.
5. The Proctor and the Joint Proctors shall be appointed by the Kulpati from amongst the teachers of the University ordinarily for a period not exceeding two years at a time.
6. The Proctor and each of the Joint Proctors shall be paid allowances as follows:-
 1. Proctor Rs. 200=00 Per Month
 2. Joint Proctor Rs. 100=00 Per Month
7. Powers and Duties of the Proctor - The Proctor shall take action in all matters which are referred to him for disciplinary action by any responsible person or constituted authority of the University. He may also take action in matters which come to his knowledge and which, in his opinion call for disciplinary action. However cases of discipline in examination halls shall be dealt with in accordance with provisions of relevant Ordinances.
8. The Proctor may delegate any of his powers to Joint Proctor/Joint Proctors. In the absence of Proctor the senior most Joint Proctor shall act as Proctor and shall have all such powers which are exercised by the Proctor.
9. If in the Opinion of the Proctor, the act of indiscipline requiring action is not of a serious nature, he may hold a summary inquiry and shall have powers to impose the following penalties.

Approved by the Executive Council under Resolution No. 25, Dated 18-1-1986)

 1. a formal caution.
 2. a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.00
10. If in the opinion of the Proctor, the breach of discipline is of a serious nature, he may refer the case for investigation by the Proctorial Board. Proctor and Joint Proctor or any two Joint Proctors shall constitute a quorum for sittings for such investigation.
11. The investigation by the Proctorial Board may include :

- 
- (i) Issue of show cause notice to the person/persons concerned specifying the nature of charge/complaint against him/them.
 - (ii) Recording of statement of the accused person/persons and of such other person/persons as the Board may deem necessary the Discipline Committee for giving its opinion regarding the action to be taken.
 - (iii) Examination of such other documents or evidences as the Proctorial Board may find necessary.

12. (a) After investigation the Board may recommend, imposition of fine and/ or other punishment which could include a recommendation for rustication or expulsion of student/----- students also.

(b) Recommendations of impositions of fine not exceeding Rs. 50.00 shall be sent to the Proctor for action. All other recommendations shall be sent to the Kulpati who may accept the recommendation or pass such orders there on as he may deem fit.

13. In cases of acts of indiscipline which in the opinion of the proctor are of very serious nature or which constitute a grave offence under the criminal law the investigation and action on the same may be entrusted to the Police. In all such cases the Proctor shall send a report to the Police and also inform the Registrar.

14. In the cases under investigation by the proctorial Board or the Police, if the Proctor is of the opinion that immediate action is called for in the interest of maintenance of -----and discipline he may recommend to the Kulpati that the student/students concerned, be suspended from than classes pending investigation of their casos. If the Kulpati accepts the recommendation, the student/students shall be suspended by the Proctor from their classes for the period specified in the order of the Kulpati.

15. There shall be a Discipline Committee consisting of the following:-

1. Proctor
2. Den, Student Welfare
3. Professor In charge of Students Union
4. Joint proctors

5. Warden of the Hostels & Joint Wardens
6. President of Students Society of the U.T.D.
7. Two other students nominated by the Kulpati

One of the Joint Proctors will be nominated by the proctor as Secretary of the Discipline Committee.

16. The Discipline Committee shall ordinarily be convened once in each academic term and it shall review general situation regarding discipline in the University and make suggestions in this regard. Any specific cases of indiscipline may also be referred to the Discipline Committee for giving its opinion regarding the action to be taken.

17. All punishments awarded to students shall be recorded in a register to be maintained by the Proctor. The Register shall be a permanent record of the University and shall contain such details as may be prescribed or approved by the Executive Council.

18. Certificate regarding character and conduct of student of the University Teaching Department may be issued to him by the Proctor. However, in the case of a student who has been awarded punishment three or more times by the Proctor himself or on the recommendation of the Proctor, the fact that he was so penalized shall be mentioned in the certificate of character and conduct to be issued by the Proctor. The certificate of character and conduct issued by the Proctor shall be the only valid Certificate of the University in that regard.

19. If the Proctor finds that in any incident of disturbance or breach of peace, certain persons who are not on the rolls of the University are involved or are likely to be involved he may send a recommendation to the Kulpati that the University Campus be declared out of bounds for such persons. If the recommendations is accented by the Kulpati a notification declaring that such persons are debarred from entering the campus shall be issued by the Proctor and a copy of the notification shall be sent to the District Magistrate and the Superintendent of Police and such other administrative authorities as the Kulpati may deem fit. So long as the notification issued under this paragraph remains in force entry into the campus of person/persons, debarred from entering the campus, shall be deemed to be an act of criminal trespass and shall be dealt with accordingly.

ORDINANCE No. 78

DIPLOMA COURSE IN SERICULTURE (ONE YEAR COURSE)

A candidate who has passed B. Sc. degree examination with Botany, Zoology of Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University or any other University recognised by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University shall be eligible for admission to the course as per University Rules.

Scheme of Examination:

The examination will comprise of two theory papers each of 100 marks and three hours duration and a practical 100 marks, six hours duration. Students will be required to visit Central Silk Research and Training Institute, Mysore as a part of curriculum.

Candidates shall have to pass in theory and practical examinations separately. The pass marks shall be 50% in theory and practicals separately. Candidates securing 60% or more marks in the aggregate of the written papers and practicals shall be declared to have passed the examination with merit.

Remaining successful candidates will be declared to have passed the examination in pass division.

The candidate admitted to this course shall be required to pay the following fees:-

Draft Ordinance No. 80

Diploma in Translation

A candidate, who after passing his/her B.A. degree examination with Hindi Literature/English Literature/Linguistics has completed a regular course of study in University Teaching Department or in any college completed to the University for one academic year, shall be committed to the Diploma in Translation examination.

The students of this course will be treated as and shall not be entitled to the privileges and facilities accorded to the regular students.

Candidates securing 60% or more marks in the aggregate shall be declared to have passed in the first division and those obtaining less than 60% but not less than 48% the second class, and those obtaining less than but not less than 36% in the third class.

ORDINANCE No. 81

DIPLOMA IN CEMENT CHEMISTRY

A candidate who has passed B.Sc. degree examination with Chemistry of Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University or any other University recognised by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University shall be eligible for admission to the course as per University rules.

Scheme of Examination -

The examination will comprise of Two theory papers each of 100 (Hundred) marks and three hours duration and a Practical of 100 marks, of five hours duration. Students will be required to visit Cement factories and Plants (for a minimum period of 60 days) as a part of curriculum.

Candidates shall have to pass in theory and practical examinations separately. The pass marks shall be 50% in theory and practicals separately. Candidates securing 60% in theory and practicals shall be declared to have passed the examination with merit. Remaining successful candidates will be declared to have passed the examination in pass division.

ORDINANCE No-82

MASTER OF ARTS CLASSICS EXAMINATION

1. The examination for the degree of Master of Arts Classics shall consist of two parts-

- (a) The Previous Examination and
- (b) The Final Examination.

2. A candidate who after taking his Bachelor Degree in Classics of Shastri or an examination of any Statutory University in India which has been recognised by the University as equivalent to the Bachelor's degree in classics of the University and has completed a regular course of study in the teaching department of the University or in a College in the subject in which he offers himself for examination for one academic year shall be admitted to the Previous Examination for the degree of Master of Arts Classics. The subject of M.A. Previous Classics examination will be that which the candidate had already offered in his B.A. Classics examination.

3. A candidate who after passing the M. A. Classics Previous examination of the University, has completed a regular course of study of one academic year in a teaching department of the University or in a college shall be admitted to the Final Examination for the degree of Master of Arts Classics in the subject in which he/she has passed the Previous Examination.

A candidate who has passed the Previous examination for the degree of Master of Arts Classics of another University may also be admitted to the Final Examination for the degree of Master of Arts Classics after obtaining necessary permission from the Kulpati, provided that he offered for his Previous Examination a course of study of an equivalent standard with almost identical syllabus as is required for the Previous Examination of this University and has attended a regular course of study for one academic year in a college affiliated to the University or a teaching department of the University.

4. Besides regular students and subject to their compliance with this Ordinance, Ex-students and non collegiate candidates shall be eligible for admission to the Examination as per provision of Ordinance No. 6 relating to Examinations (General)

Provided that in the subject where field work or practical work is prescribe only such candidates will be permitted to appear as non-collegiate candidate who has obtained permission of the Head of the University Teaching Department or Princip of the College teaching such subjects.

Provided that non-collegiate candidate shall be permitted to offer only such subject/papers as are taught to the regular students at any of the University Teaching Department or College.

5. The subject of the Examination shall be one of the following -

- (i) Ved
- (ii) Vyakaran
- (iii) Darshan
- (iv) Sahitya
- (v) Jyotish
- (vi) Dharmshastra
- (vii) Nirukta
- (viii) Puranetihas
- (ix) Karmakanda
- (x) Tantra.

A candidate securing 60% or more marks in the M. A. Classics Previous Examination will be eligible to offer Dissertation in lieu of one of the optional papers for the Final. A regular candidate can offer dissertation with the permission of the Professor and Head of Department of his Institution while a private candidate will have to secure the prior permission in writing of any one of the Professor of the subject working in an Institution within the jurisdiction of the University and will work under supervision of that Professor after obtaining prior permission of the University to that effect.

6. A candidate who has passed the M. A. Classics Examination of the University in any subject shall be allowed to present himself for the M. A. Classics Examination in any one or more of the optional papers in that subject not taken by him at the examination and if successful will be given a certificate to that effect.

No candidate shall be allowed to offer more than two additional papers in any one year.

7. For both the Previous and Final Examination a candidate will be declared successful if he/she obtains atleast 36% of the aggregate marks in the subject. In subjects in which both theory and practical examination are held an examinee must pass separately in the Practical Examination obtaining not less than 36% marks.

8. No division will be assigned on the result of the Previous Examination. The division in which a candidate is placed shall be determined on the basis of aggregate of marks obtained in both the M.A. Classics Previous and M. A. Classics Final Examination.

9. Successful candidates who obtain 60% or more of the aggregate marks shall be placed in the first division those obtaining less than 60% but not less than 48% in the second division and all other successful candidates obtaining less than 48% in third division.

10. Candidates who have passed the M.A. Classics Examination of the University in any subject in Third or Second Division and desire to appear at the M.A. Classics Examination in the same subject for improving divisions may without attending regular course of study in a College affiliated to the University or in a Teaching Department of the University be allowed to appear at the aforesaid examination as non-collegiate student on the following conditions-

(i) There shall be only two divisions for such candidates first division and second division. The marks required for obtaining these division shall be the same as prescribed in this ordinance i. e. examinees who are successful in final of the examination and have obtained 60% or more marks in the aggregate of previous and final examination taken together shall be placed in the first division and examinees who are successful in Final Examination and have obtained less than 60% but not less than 48% marks in aggregate of previous and final examination taken together shall be placed in the second division.

- (ii) The result of the candidates obtaining less than 48% marks in the aggregate of Previous and Final Examination taken together shall not be declared.
- (iii) Candidates shall have the option to appear at both the previous and final examination in the same year and for being successful at the examination, the candidates shall obtain 48% of the aggregate marks.

Provided that such candidates who opt to appear in previous and final examination separately shall have to obtain minimum aggregate required for the previous examination but he will have to obtain at least 48% in the aggregate of previous and final examination taken together or else his result will be cancelled.

- (iv) The syllabus for the examination shall be same as prescribed for the year in which the examination is held.
- (v) Not more than two attempts shall be allowed to such a candidate failure or non-appearance at the examination after permission has been accorded by the University shall be counted as an attempt.

Provided however such candidates who opt to appear at the previous and final examination separately will be allowed only one attempt at the previous examination and two attempts at the final examination.

- (vi) Candidates who wish to avail the opportunity given in foregoing paras will have to apply for permission as required in the ordinance relating to admission of non-collegiate students to the University examination along with requisite registration fee.
- (vii) In case, a student improves his division under provision of this para, the fresh degree will be issued after canceling his first degree.

11. Transitory provision the repealed ordinance relating to Master of Arts Classics examination shall remain effecting till the examination of 1991 and this new Ordinance relating to Master of Arts Classics shall be applicable from the examination of 1992.

POST-GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN ADULT EDUCATION AND EXTENSION

Admission Qualification

A candidate who possesses at least Second Division Post-Graduate Degree in any faculty will be eligible for admission in P.G. Diploma in Adult Education & Extension.

However preference will be given to those having:-

- (a) B. Ed. Degree,
- (b) Experience in the field of Adult Education and Extension Work.

Admission will be given on merit basis.

MODE:

- (i) Contract-cum-correspondence learning stream number of Student -50
- (ii) Regular Course Stream -Number of Student - 20.

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ORDINANCE No. 84
(CERTIFICATE COURSE IN COMPUTER MANAGEMENT)

1. The Course of study shall be of 6 (Six.) month's duration, as prescribed in the Syllabus.
2. The Course will contain total Six papers, out of which 4 (four) Theory papers and 2 (two) Practical papers.
3. The Course will be a part-time and be run in morning or evening hours. This course will be open for graduates of all the branches. Employees and post-graduate students may also take admission in this course.

(a) **Eligibility:** - Qualification for admission to this certificate course will be Bachelors degree of the University or any other statutory University recognised for the purpose.

(b) **Admission Procedure:** - Application will be invited from interested candidates through advertisement, published in leading newspapers of the region. The applicants seeking admission to this course will be required to under go through selection process, as follows:

Written Test (Objective)	75%
Personal Interview	25%
Total	100%

A merit list will be preparing on the basis of marks obtained in written test and first 40 candidates will be called for personal interview. Total 20 selected candidates will be taken for this course.

Fees-The students selected for this course will be required to pay the following fees for a session:

c.	Admission fees	350.00
d.	Tuition fee	350.00
e.	Computer charges	500.00
f.	Development fee	500.00

4. Admission will be made normally in July and December in each Academic year.
5. There shall be two University Examination at the end of each session. These Examinations shall normally be held in January and July.
6. A candidate who, in each theory and practical of any session does not has a minimum of 75% of attendance shall not be qualified for appearing in the ansuring examination for that session and shall be declared as a Detained Candidate.
7. (a) A condonation of 10% in respect of attendance only may be granted by the Principal of the college/ Head of the Deptt. and a further condonation of 5% by the Kulpati.
(b) It shall be the entire responsibility of the student to ensure that he has the required percentage of attendance for being eligible to appear in the examination within the specified period.
(c) Simply filling of an examination form, paying the examination fee, or getting the admission card from the University shall not entitle the student to appear in the examination. A student may still be debarred from appearing in the examination in the college records indate that he does not meet the academic requirements as already defined above.
8. Preparation leave of SEVEN days will normally be given before the commencement of written part of examination.
9. In order to be successful at any of the examinations, an examinee must secure not less than:
 - i. 35% as minimum marks in each written course.
 - ii. 40% as minimum marks in each practical course.
 - iii. 35% as minimum marks in aggregate.
10. A candidate who fails to secure the required minimum percentage of marks in any of Theory paper or Practical as defined at above, at any examination shall be declared the Unsuccessful. Such a candidate will not be given the certificate of the course.

11. A candidate, who fails to secure the prescribed minimum percentage of marks at any examination in more than One course (subject) Theory or practical, shall be required to re-appear in that paper/course in the next examination as Ex-Student.

12. The award of the certificate in Computers Management shall be based on the marks secured in all the courses of final examinations with the equal weightage assigned to the all the course as given below:-

Course 1	100 marks
Course 2	100 marks
Course 3	100 marks
Course 4	100 marks
Course 5 (Practical)	100 marks
Course 6 (Practical)	100 marks

Total 600 Marks.

13. The division for the declare of Certificate in Computer Management shall be awarded on the following basis:-

i. 35% and above but less than 50% of the grand total marks shall be placed in the pass Division

ii. 50% and above but less than 60% of the grand total marks shall be placed in the Second Division.

iii. 65% and above but less than 75% of the grand total marks shall placed in the First Division.

iv. 75% and above of the grand total marks shall be placed in the First Division with Honors.

14. The provisions of the Ordinance No. 5 and 6 shall be applicable to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance.

MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATION (M.C.A.)
SEMESTER EXAMINATION.

(Approved in Faculty of Engineering hold on 4-1-1993)

1. There shall be the following six examinations for the degree of Master of Computer Application as stated below:-

Master of Computer Application (First Semester)

Master of Computer Application (Second Semester)

Master of Computer Application (Third Semester)

Master of Computer Application (Fourth Semester)

Master of Computer Application (Fifth Semester)

Master of Computer Application (Sixth Semester)

2. (i) MCA First, Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Semester Examinations will Comprise of (a) Written Papers (b) Sessional work and (c) Laboratory work.

- (ii) MCA Sixth Semester Examination will comprise of (a) written papers (b) Sessional work and (c) Project work.

- (iii) The examinations in written papers shall be held at the end of each semester according to the schemes of Examination given in the appendix 'A'

The detailed scheme of examinations and syllabi as may be in force from time to time shall be published by the University.

3. (a) The duration of the academic years of MCA will be divided into six semesters as follows :-

First, Third and Fifth Semester:	(i) 1st July to 30th November (ii) Examination for written papers at the end of the Semester: 11th December to 30th December.
Second and Fourth Semester:	(i) 1st January to 30th April (ii) Examination for written papers, at the end of the semester: 11th June to 30th June.
Sixth Semester	(i) 1st January to 30th April (ii) Examination for written papers and project evaluation at the end of semester: 11 th June to 30 th June.

(b) After a semester examination, candidates may be provisionally admitted to the higher semester till the declaration of the lower semester result. He will be permitted to continue in the higher semester only if he clears the lower semester.

4. A candidate seeking admission to the Master of Computer Application (MCA) First Semester Examination shall have passed the Final Examination for B.Sc./B.Com. degree of Pandit Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur (C.G.) or equivalent with Mathematics/Statistics as one of subjects and shall have obtained not less than 50% marks in the aggregate in the Final year of B. Sc. /B.Com. examination.

5. (i) A student of college seeking admission to the examination shall :

- (a) apply for admission to the examination through the principal of the college and
- (b) produce the following certificates from the Principal of the college viz. certificate
 1. of good conduct,
 2. of fitness to present himself at the examination.
 3. of having pursued a regular course of study and

4. of possessing the minimum academic qualification prescribed for appearing in this examination.

(ii) For the purpose of this paragraph, the fitness of a student to present himself at the examination shall be judged by the principal by:-

(a) The record of his academic work in the college,

(b) his intellectual capacity and

(c) the time at his disposal before the commencement of the examination for making up the deficiencies of any, in his studies.

(iii) The certificate required by this paragraph shall reach the Registrar not later than the date preceding by two weeks the date of commencement of the written examination.

6. Any deficiency in attendance at the course of study for the examination may be condoned subject to a maximum of 15% in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance No. 6 relating to condonation of deficiency in attendance.

7. On the report of the Principal of the college, the Executive Council may refuse admission to, or exclude any candidate from the examination at any stage, if it is satisfied that such candidate is not fit person to be admitted thereto. The reason for such exclusion shall be recorded.

8. The candidates disobeying the instructions of the Centre Superintendent in the Examination Centre of resorting to any sort of unfair means at the examination shall be dealt with according to the provisions of ordinance Nos. 5 and 6 of the University.

9. (i) Every application for admission to the Master of Computer Application (First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Semester) Examination shall be in the form prescribed by the Academic Council and shall reach the Registrar not less than four weeks before the commencement of the examination. It shall be accompanied by such examination and other fee for each semester

examination as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.

(ii) Every application of a candidate other than a student of a college seeking re-admission to the examination shall be made in the form prescribed by the Academic Council and shall together with the fee as stated in paragraph (I) and such additional fee as may be prescribed by the University reach the Registrar atleast four weeks or such shorter period as may be prescribed by the Academic Council in this behalf, before the commencement of the examination.

(iii) A candidate who fails to pass or to present himself at the examination shall not be entitled to a refund of the fee, but in genuine and hard cases of sickness etc. a part of the fee can be adjusted towards to immediate next examination, if such an application is sent so as to reach the Registrar not later than 30 days from the date of commencement of examination at which the candidate was to appear.

10. The scheme of examination for Master of Computer Application will be prescribed by the university from time to time.

11. In case of an examinee for Master of Computer Application examination, who is not a regular student of the College, the Sessional marks obtained during the period in which he prosecuted the course for the examination in a college shall be taken into account for the purpose of determining his result at the examination.

12. The minimum pass marks which an examinee shall obtain in each subject shall be. (i) 40percent in each theory paper (ii) 60 percent in each Sessional and (iii) 50% in each laboratory test/viva-voce examination/project evaluation and (iv) 50% of the total aggregate.

13. A candidate shall be eligible to appear in the succeeding semester examination only after having passed the preceding semester examination provided that if a candidate fails in any one theory paper in any one semester examination, he will be promoted to the next semester course. A candidate failing in one theory paper of any semester shall be eligible to take examination of the paper in which he has failed along with the next examination of the concerned semester. He shall be eligible to carry the back log of one paper of each semester but in any case he shall not be permitted to carry the back log of one paper of each semester but in any case he shall not be permitted to carry backlog of more than two papers at a time on one theory and one practical.

14. In each semester examination, at least 50% theory papers shall be internal.

15. (a) There shall be no classification of the examinees successful in each semester of the examination.

(b) The classification of examinee after having passed all the six semester examinations shall be made as follows:-

(i) The examinee who have obtained 75 percent or more in the aggregate considering all the six semesters taken together shall be placed in First Division with Honors.

(ii) The examinee who have obtained 65 percent or more marks but less than 75 percent in the aggregate considering all the six semesters taken together shall be placed in the First Division.

(iii) The examinee who has obtained less than 65 percent marks or more than 50 percent in the aggregate considering all the six semesters taken together shall be placed in the Second Division.

(iv) An examinee must secure minimum 50% of the total aggregate to be declared successful in any semester examination.

16. (a) As soon as possible after the examination the Executive Council shall publish a list of successful examinee arranged in the three divisions, the names of the examinee who obtained the first ten places in First Division being arranged in order of Merit.

(b) A candidate who is successful at the Sixth Semester of the M.C./ Examination shall be awarded the MCA Degree in the form prescribed by the Academic Council in this behalf.

17. **SCRUTINY OF MARKS OR REVALUATION:** A candidate, whose result has been declared, may apply to the Registrar for the scrutiny of his marks in the written papers and the rechecking of his results, or for revaluation of his answer books but not more than two within thirty days of declaration of his result, according to the provisions laid down in Ordinances 5 and 6. The fee for scrutiny of marks shall be Rs. 8/- for one subject and Rs. 20/- for all subject while the fee for revaluation shall be Rs. 100/- for answer book.

ORDINANCE NO. 86
MASTER OF ENGINEERING BY RESEARCH

1. A candidate for the M.E. Degree must be either:
 - (a) First class and second class B.E., D.Sc. (Engg.) or B. Technology degree from a recognised University are eligible for registration.
 - (b) Candidate with A.M.I.E. are not ordinarily eligible but may be considered on individual merits.
2. A candidate for the Degree of M.E. must apply on or before October 1st or January 15th to the University on a prescribed form along with a fee of Rs. 150/- stating:
 - (i) his qualification and experience.
 - (ii) the subject on which he proposes to work.
 - (iii) the field of topic of study.
 - (iv) the name of the supervisor under whom and place of the research at which he wishes to carry on his investigation together with the supervisor's consent.
 - (v) fees payable to the University office -
 - (i) Fees for application form and copy of ordinance Rs. 20/-
 - (ii) Registration fees Rs. 150/- (Non refundable.)
 - (iii) Library fees Rs. 24.00 per annum,
 - (iv) Library caution Money Rs. 20.00 (Refundable.)
3. The candidate will have to appear before the research degree committee, at his own cost, for viva-voce test.
4. The person recommended for appointment as supervisor must be -
 - (i) A Master's degree in Engineering with Ten years experience research and/or who has got a teaching experience, to graduate classes and who is working within the ————— of the University.
 - (ii) A teacher having exceptionally good qualifications in Engineering and record of work serving in the application college may be recognised as guide with experience of about seven years.
5. The application shall be placed before the research degree committee which shall consist of the Kulpati, The Dean of the faculty concerned, the chairman-Board of studies and one external expert member nominated by the kulpati in consultation with the chairman and dean of the faculty.
6. If the Research degree committee is satisfied in the viva-voce test that subject offered is one which can profitably be pursued under the proposed supervisor the committee may recommend the application to the academic council for approval.
7. If permission is granted by the academic council the candidate shall pursue his research work in any research centers to be approved by the faculty under the supervision of a approved guide and on the subject the supervision of approved guide and on the subject the supervision on a approved guide and on the subject approved, for not less than twenty four months from approved, for not less than twenty months from the date of research degree committee meeting. provided also that the research degree committee on sufficient grounds may recommend for the curtailment of aforesaid period be not more than 25 percent.

8. A candidate for M.S. Degree may be allowed to do Research work in allied subject in the faculty under two supervisors if the research degree committee is satisfied that the subject required guidance of two supervisors.
9. If the candidate does not submit his thesis within five years from the date of permission his registration will be cancelled.
10. A panel of atleast six names ——— appointment of examiners shall be prepared by the external expert of the research degree committee out of which the examination committee will prepare a panel of atleast four names. Provided that where a panel of names is not recommended from the external expert within 30 days from the date on which he was requested to submit the panel to the Kulpati may call upon the aforesaid committee to draw up its panel without the recommendation of the external expert.
11. Before submission of the thesis the candidate must publish atleast three papers on the subject of his work, in the reputed journals of a Institution of Engineers, etc., the list of which is given separate.
12. The candidate will be required to produce a certificate of the guide and Head of Institution to the effect that he has worked under him for 180 days and has published 3 papers in the journals listed.
The candidate shall also remit with three copies of the typewritten or Prints. Thesis, a sum of Rs. 750/- only.
13. The thesis submitted will be adjudicated by two external examiners to be appointed by the examination committee. In the external examiners approve the thesis the candidate will be called upon for a Viva-Voce examination which will be conducted by one external and guide who will be the Internal examiner for Viva-voce test in the presence of college faculty members. Theory will aducate the performance and on approval by them, M.E. Degree with first division aquivalent to 65% (Sixty five percent) will be awarded. The external examiner will be nominated by the Kulpati out of two external examiners who has examined the thesis.
14. If both examiners reject the thesis it will be rejected. If one of the ——— recommend and the other rejects, the thesis will be referred to the third examiner out the ——— appointed by the Examination committee. If the third examiner rejects the Thesis, it will be rejected. If one of the examiners approves and the other recommends for revision, the thesis will have to be revised and resubmitted alongwith a fresh fee of Rs. 750/- and it will be sent to the same set of Examiners who has approved the thesis and one who has asked for revision. If one of the examiners recommend revision while the other rejects, the Thesis will be rejected.
15. The Research Degree committee may not later than Eight Months from the date on which permission was granted to him modify the scheme of his Research work or nature of scang of his subjel on the Recommendation of the Supervisor and the Chairman of the Board of studies ———

ORDINANCE No. 88.

(Under section 38)

MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

1. This degree shall be known as Master of Business Administration (MBA).

2. (a) The duration of this course for Full Time course of study shall extend over two full academic sessions and each of these academic sessions shall be subdivided into two semesters each.

(b) The duration of this course for Part-time course of study shall extend over 4 full academic sessions and each of these academic sessions shall be subdivided into two semesters each.

3. The minimum qualification for application for admission to MBA course shall be as follows:

(a) A candidate holding a graduate degree or post graduate degree of the University or of any other University recognised to be equivalent thereto by the University with atleast 50 per cent of marks (45 percent in case of SC, ST & OBC candidates) in aggregate in the Faculty of Arts, Science, Home Science, Social Science, Agriculture Commerce, Medicine, Engineering or Life Science shall be eligible for application for admission to MBA course :

Provided that the following examinations shall not be taken as basic degree for application for admission to MBA course :

as also any graduate degree for which the minimum admission qualification is a basic degree course of three years duration.

4. The admission to the MBA course of study either Full time or Part-time shall be made on merit to be decided on the basis of written entrance test, selection interview and group discussion organised by the University.

English shall be the medium for the entrance test, instruction and examination for the course of study.

The admission so granted shall be further governed by the University rules applicable to all the students in the University and the decision of the Kulpati in case of any dispute shall be final.

5. The total intake capacity of the Full-time or Part-time MBA course shall be as per AICTE norms and as decided by the University from time to time.

6. The students admitted to MBA course shall not be permitted to appear at any other examination.

7. The MBA course (Full-time or Part-time) shall consist of -

- (a) Such courses/papers as may be prescribed by the University;
- (b) Such in-plant training as may be prescribed by the University;
- (c) Such factory visits as may be prescribed by the University.

8. There shall be a University Examination conducted by the University at the end of each semester on the basis of course contents and scheme of examination as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.

9. A student after having prosecuted a regular course of study in either Full time or Part time course of study in the University as prescribed by the University shall be eligible to be admitted to the semester examination if he/she had attended at least 75 percent of the classes of the semester concerned.

10. A candidate in order to be declared pass at any of the semester examination shall be required to obtain at least 40 percent marks in each of the theory papers and 50 percent marks in the aggregate of theory papers; 50 percent marks in internal assessment and project report separately.

11. A candidate declared pass at the First Semester examination shall be eligible to be promoted to the Second Semester and shall be eligible to take up the Second Semester examination if he/she fulfils all other conditions to be eligible to appear at the examination.

Provided that if a candidate after passing in the Internal Assessment of all the papers and appearing in all the theory papers of the First semester examination, fails in any One or Two or Three theory paper(s) at the First semester examination, but secures at least 48% marks in aggregate in the papers cleared at the First semester examination, he/she shall be allowed to keep the term (ATKT) and shall be eligible to be promoted to the second semester. In this case, the same student is required to take up the examination of ATKT paper(s) in which he/she had failed with the subsequent first semester examination.

Maximum three chances for clearing the ATKT paper will be given to the candidates failed in the theory papers.

12. A candidate declared pass at the First and Second Semester examination shall be eligible to be promoted to the Third semester examination and shall be eligible to take up the III Semester examination, if he/she fulfils all other conditions to appear at the examination.

Provided that if a candidate after passing in the Internal Assessment of all the papers and appearing in all the theory papers of the second semester examination, fails in any One or Two or Three theory paper(s) at the second semester examination, but secures at least 48% marks in aggregate in the papers cleared at the second semester examination, he/she shall be allowed to keep the term (ATKT) and shall be eligible to be promoted to the second semester. In this case, the same student is required to take up the examination of ATKT paper(s) in which he/she had failed with the subsequent second semester examination.

Maximum three chances for clearing the ATKT paper will be given to the candidates failed in the theory papers.

13. A candidate declared pass at the I, II and III semester examination shall only be eligible to be promoted to the Fourth Semester.

Provided that if a candidate after passing in the Internal Assessment of all the papers and appearing in all the theory papers of the third semester examination, fails in any One or Two or Three theory paper(s) at the third semester examination, but secures at least 48% marks in aggregate in the papers cleared at the second semester examination, he/she shall be allowed to keep the term (ATKT) and shall be eligible to be promoted to the fourth semester. In this case, the same student is required to take up the examination of ATKT paper(s) in which he/she had failed with the subsequent third semester examination.

Maximum three chances for clearing the ATKT paper will be given to the candidates failed in the theory papers.

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14. A candidate declared pass at the I,II and II Semester examination shall only be eligible to be promoted to the Fourth Semester.

Provided that a candidate who after prosecuting a Part-time course of study after passing in the internal assessment of all the papers and appearing in all the theory papers of III Semester examination but secures at least 50 percent of marks in aggregate in the theory papers and internal assessment cleared at the III Semester examination, he/she shall be eligible to keep term and shall be eligible to be permitted to appear at the Fourth Semester examination and shall also appear at the III Semester examination in the paper(s) in which he/she had failed along with Fourth Semester examination if he/she has cleared the backlog of Second Semester and if he/she fulfils all other conditions to eligible to appear at the Fourth Semester examination if he/she fails to clear the theory papers of III Semester he/she shall be eligible to appear as an Ex-student in the paper(s) of the III Semester at the immediate subsequent examination of the III Semester and shall be required to pass in the theory paper(s) at the examination and if he/she fails to appear at the examination for any reason or fails to clear the theory paper(s) of the examination, he/she shall cease to be a student of the MBA Course of study.

15. A candidate declared pass at the I,II, III and IV semester examination shall be eligible to be promoted to the VI semester and shall be eligible to take up the Fifth Semester examination if he/she fulfils all other conditions to appear at the examination.

Provided that if a candidate after passing in the internal assessment of all the papers and appearing in all the theory papers of Fourth Semester fails in only one of the theory papers of Fourth semester examination but secures at least 50 percent marks in aggregate in the theory papers and internal assessment already cleared at the Fourth semester he/she shall be eligible to keep term and shall be eligible to be promoted to V semester and shall be eligible to be permitted to appear at the Fifth Semester and shall also appear at the Fourth Semester examination in the paper (s) in which he/she had failed along with the V Semester examination, if he/she fulfils all other conditions to be eligible to appear at the V semester examination and if he/she fails to clear the theory paper (s) of the IV semester he/she shall be eligible to appear as an ex-student in the paper (s) of the IV semester at the immediate subsequent examination of IV semester and shall be required to pass in the theory paper (s) at the examination and if he/she fails to appear at the examination for any reason or fails to clear the theory paper (s) in the examination he/she shall cease to be a student of MBA course of study.

16. A candidate declared pass at the I, II, III, IV and V Semester examination shall only be eligible to be promoted to the VI Semester and shall be eligible to take up the Sixth Semester examination if he/she fulfils all other conditions to appear at the examination.

Provided that if a candidate prosecuting a part time course of study after passing in the internal assessment of all the papers and appearing in all the theory papers of Fifth Semester fails in only one or two theory papers of Fifth Semester examination but secures at least 50 percent marks in aggregate in the theory papers and internal assessment already cleared at the fifth semester, he/she shall be eligible to keep term and shall be eligible to be promoted to the VI semester and shall be eligible to be permitted to appear at the VI semester and shall appear at the V Semester examination in the papers in which he/she had failed along with the VI Semester examination if he/she has cleared the back log of IV Semester and if he/she fulfils all other conditions to be eligible to appear at the VI Semester examination, and if he/she fails to clear the theory paper of the V Semester he/she shall be eligible to appear as an ex-student in the paper (s) of the V Semester at the immediate subsequent examination of V Semester and shall be required to pass in the theory papers at the examination and if he/she fails to appear at the examination for any reason or fails to clear the

theory papers (s) in the examination he/she shall cease to be a student of MBA course of study.

17. A candidate declared pass at the I, II, III, IV, V and VI Semester examination shall only be eligible to be promoted to the VII Semester and shall be eligible to take up the Seventh semester examination if he/she fulfils all other conditions to appear at the examination.

Provided that if a candidate after passing in the internal assessment of all the papers and appearing in all the theory papers of Sixth Semester fails in only one of the theory papers of Sixth Semester examination but secures at least 50 percent marks in aggregate in the theory papers and internal assessment already cleared at the Sixth Semester, he/she shall be eligible to keep term and shall be eligible to be permitted to appear at the VII Semester and shall appear at the VI Semester examination in the papers in which he/she had failed along with the VII Semester examination, if he/she has cleared the back log of V Semester and if he/she fulfils all other conditions to be eligible to appear at the VII Semester examination and if he/she fails to clear the theory paper of the VI Semester he/she shall be eligible to appear as an Ex-student in the paper (s) of the VI Semester examination at the immediate subsequent examination of VI semester and shall be required to pass in all the theory paper (s) at the examination and if he/she fails to appear at the examination for any reason or fails to clear all the theory papers in the examination he/she shall cease to be a student of MBA course of study.

18. A candidate declared pass at the I, II, III, IV, V, VI and VII Semester shall only be declared eligible to be promoted to the VIII Semester and shall be eligible to take up the examination of VIII Semester if he/she fulfils all other conditions to appear at the examination.

19. A candidate after passing at the internal assessment of all the papers and Project Report and is eligible to be admitted to the Semester examination fails to appear at the examination due to illness or any other unavoidable reasons, he/she will be permitted to appear at the next two subsequent examinations of the Semester concerned as an Ex-student of the Semester only and in case he/she fails to pass the examination,

he/she shall cease to be student of the MBA, Full Time or Part Time course of study of the University.

20. A candidate not permitted to take up the First Semester examination due to shortage of attendance shall be required to apply for admission afresh in the next academic session and shall also be required to appear at the admission test.

21. There shall be no second full or supplementary examination for any semester examination.

22. There shall not be any revaluation only in theory papers.

23. A candidate obtaining 60 percent or more marks in aggregate of I, II, III and IV semesters in case of Full Time course and I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII and VIII Semesters in case of Part-time course, taken together shall be declared to have passed in the First division.

A candidate obtaining less than 60 percent but not less than 50% of marks in aggregate of all the Semesters taken together shall be declared to have passed in the Second division.

24. No person shall be admitted to MBA course if he/she has already passed the MBA examination of the University or any equivalent examination of any other University or statutory body.

25. Each student shall be required to pay the fees of the course as may be prescribed by the University from time to time.

26. In matters of admission, attendance, and examination and in all other matters not provided for in this Ordinance, the MBA Degree course shall be governed by the general provisions of the relevant Ordinance save in so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance.
