


ASSUMPTIONS AND PREJUDICE

NEGATIVE PRECONCEPTS:

- Maitreyi Samhita: "Woman is said to be a mere addict like misogynist, misfortune, alcohol or gambling.
- <u>Valmiki Ramayana</u>: "The woman is obstinate, jealous, bitter, full of sexual instinct."
- <u>Padma Purana</u>: "Chaste women are expected to be skilled like a maid and slave like a prostitute."
- <u>Sage Agastya II (13.5)</u>: It's the nature of the woman that she clings to a man only when he is in the state of prosperity and leaves as soon his bad days begin.
- Mahabharata XIII (38.30): "Women have the tendency to ie, waste time, has excessive attachment to jewels, anger, vileness and deceit."

EXAMINING GROWING UP AS A BOY OR A GIRL


BOY


WHAT IS SEX ????

- □Sex is usually categorized as female or male but there is variation in the biological attributes that comprise sex and how those attributes are expressed


WHAT IS GENDER????
